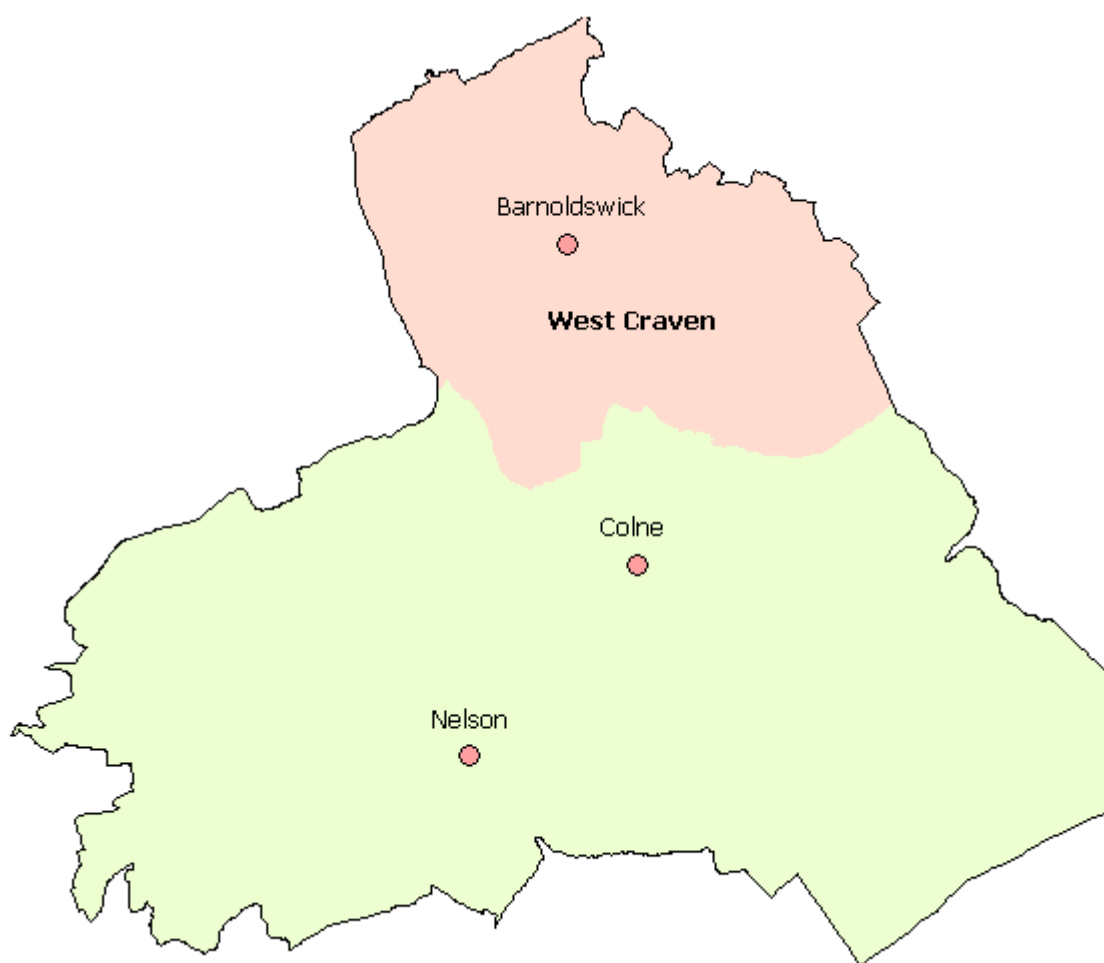


Indices of Deprivation Summary 2010 - West Craven Area



Overview of the 2010 Indices of Deprivation

The Indices of Deprivation is considered the most significant research into poverty in England ever put together and is used to allocate around 1% of all government funding. The regional boundaries it covers are Lower Super Output Areas which usually have a population of around 1,500 people. The data used for this release was mainly taken from 2008 and is based on 38 indicators across 7 domains. These domains are:

- Income Deprivation
- Employment Deprivation
- Education, Skills and Training Deprivation
- Crime
- Health Deprivation and Disability
- Barriers to Housing and Services
- Living Environment Deprivation

Coates Ward

With an estimated population of 5,704 people (ONS 2009), Coates is made up of 4 Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs):

E01025191 Pendle 001A (1,252 people)
E01025192 Pendle 001B (1,412 people)
E01025193 Pendle 001C (1,590 people)
E01025194 Pendle 001D (1,450 people)

The average Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) score across the country is 21.67. In Coates the average score of IMD in 2010 was 18.32, which is slightly below the national average. Broken down by LSOAs the scores were as follows:

Pendle 001A 10.27
Pendle 001B 27.30
Pendle 001C 14.95
Pendle 001D 20.75

3 of the 4 LSOAs in Coates are below the average deprivation score nationally, with just Pendle 001B above the national average. Pendle 001B is in the top 5% in the country for deprived living environments, with Pendle 001D in the top 10%.

Craven Ward

With an estimated population of 5,518 people (ONS 2009), Craven is made up of 4 Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs):

E01025195 Pendle 002A (1,313 people)
E01025196 Pendle 002B (1,533 people)
E01025197 Pendle 002C (1,324 people)
E01025198 Pendle 002D (1,348 people)

The average Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) score across the country is 21.67. In Craven the average score for the 2010 IMD was 20.16, which like Coates is slightly below the national average. Broken down by LSOAs the scores were as follows:

Pendle 002A 10.03
Pendle 002B 30.62
Pendle 002C 12.30
Pendle 002D 27.69

2 of the 4 LSOAs in Craven have an IMD score above the national average. The ward also has 2 LSOAs with IMD scores that are around half of the national average. In terms of specific deprivation problems in Craven, Pendle 002B is in the top 5% in the country for deprived living environments and Pendle 002D is in the top 10% for health deprivation and disability. Moreover, by looking at sub-domain level it emerges that Pendle 002B is ranked 174th out of 32,482 LSOAs for deprived 'indoor' living environments (housing in poor condition and without central heating).

Earby Ward

With an estimated population of around 6,225 people (ONS 2009), Earby is made up of 4 Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs):

E01025199 Pendle 003A (1,599 people)
E01025200 Pendle 003B (1,566 people)
E01025201 Pendle 003C (1,586 people)
E01025202 Pendle 003D (1,484 people)

The average Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) score across the country is 21.67. In Earby the average IMD score in 2010 was 19.08, which is just below the national average. Broken down by LSOAs the scores were as follows:

Pendle 003A 15.86
Pendle 003B 21.35
Pendle 003C 21.91
Pendle 003D 17.20

The range between the deprivation scores for the 4 LSOAs in Earby is one of the lowest in Pendle, meaning that across Earby there are similar levels of deprivation. In terms of the domain types of

deprivation in Earby, the only cause for concern is that Pendle 003A is in the top 10% in the country for living deprivation.
