It is suggested that the Scrutiny Committee could revisit the survey they did some time ago about parking in Barrowford.	A scrutiny review of town centre parking was completed in October 2007 where it was found that opportunities to provide further parking in Barrowford were severely limited. Progress on actions from the review were monitored until May 2010 when it was agreed that no further monitoring was required. Any actions with partial compliance were referred to the relevant area committee for consideration.
	A more recent review of town centres took place in 2012/2013, which also covered issues around parking. Although no comments were received in the public opinion survey in respect of car parking in Barrowford, it was established that off-street car parking was extremely limited.
	There is currently one long stay car park in Barrowford, on Greenfield Road, with 30 unmarked bays. There are also 28 short stay parking spaces on the Booth's Supermarket car park, with an additional five disabled only parking bays.
	There are two residents' only parking schemes in place (one in the Nora Street area and one in the Wilton Street area). There is also an outstanding application for residents' only parking on Fountain Sq/Riverway.
Neighbourhood Priority Fund	Lancashire County Council's Neighbourhood Priority Scheme is a Lancashire-wide scheme to provide extra support to the 10% most deprived communities in the county. It enables communities, councillors and MPs to put forward small projects to be considered on

agreed criteria.
Members are advised that this Fund is within the jurisdiction of County Council and it is doubtful whether there would be anything to be gained by this Council's Scrutiny Team looking at it.

- 4. In determining items for inclusion in the Scrutiny Work Programme the following criteria should be borne in mind
 - Issue is related to the Council's priorities
 - Issue is matter of concern to Members/the public
 - Issue is not currently under review by another body or has been recently reviewed
 - Issue is one where something can be done and a scrutiny review could make a difference
 - ♦ The timing is right
- 5. The Scrutiny Team's priorities should also have a bearing
 - To drive improvements in public services which affect people in Pendle
 - To ensure that Pendle people's views and concerns are heard and are able to influence change
 - To be a critical friend in challenging the Council's Executive and its partners
 - To lead and own the scrutiny role in Pendle independently and impartially in the public interest
