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CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2015/16 AND 2016/17

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To advise members on the Committee's 2015/16 and 2016/17 capital budgets.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- (1) That members note that only the schemes listed in Appendices 1–6 have agreed funding.
- (2) That members consider the new and deferred bids at paragraphs 15 and 16.
- (2) That any late bids be considered by the Committee.
- (3) That members note the table at Appendix 3 showing the money allocated to the Bracewell and Brogden Meeting in 2015/16. The balance remaining for 2016/17 is £2,008 shown at Appendix 6

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

To enable the capital programme to be allocated efficiently and effectively.

ISSUE

Uncommitted Balance from 2014/15

1. This is £1,511.

Barnoldswick balance: £0.

• Earby balance: £1,511.

Allocation for 2015/16

2. This is £29,690 capital plus £13,860 revenue contribution to capital totalling £43,550. However, £7,920 of the revenue contribution is being held back as cover in the event that

savings do not materialise from the transfer of some assets to the town and parish councils. At this stage, this gives an effective total allocation for 2015/16 of £35,630.

In addition, £6,640 has been added to the Barnoldswick 2015/16 allocation. This is from the former LRRAP scheme and has been allocated for the Barnoldswick Town Centre Improvement Scheme at Appendix 1, item (xvii).

Deducting the £8,000 advance from the Executive for Barnoldswick, the allocation for 2015/16 is £34,270.

- Barnoldswick: £22,393 (£23,753 plus £6,640 minus £8,000).
- Earby: £11,877.

Effective Total Allocation for 2015/16

- 3. This is £35,781.
- 4. The Barnoldswick/Earby split of the 2015/16 allocation is:
 - Barnoldswick allocation: £22,393.
 - Earby allocation: £13,388.

Commitments for 2015/16

- 5. These total £33,741 (see Appendices 1 and 2 for a detailed breakdown).
- 6. The Barnoldswick/Earby split of the commitments is:
 - Barnoldswick commitments: £22,393.
 - Earby commitments: £11,348.

Balance for 2015/16

- 7. This is £1,324.
 - Barnoldswick balance: £34.
 - Earby balance: £1,290.

New Allocation for 2016/17

- 8. This is £19,800 capital plus £13,860 revenue contribution to capital totalling £33,660.
 - Barnoldswick allocation: £22,440.
 - Earby allocation: £11,220.

Effective Total Allocation for 2016/17

- 9. This is £34,984 (the Executive will be considering the funds held back from last year at the meeting on the 23 June 2016)
 - Barnoldswick effective total allocation: £22,474.
 - Earby effective total allocation: £12,510.

Commitments for 2016/17

- 10. These total £20,200 (see Appendices 4 and 5 for a detailed breakdown).
 - Barnoldswick commitments: £17,633.
 - Earby commitments: £2,567.

Balance for 2016/17

- 11. This is £14,784
 - Barnoldswick balance: £4,841.
 - Earby balance: £9,943.

Additional Source of Capital Funding

- 12. Appendix 7 to this report is a list of current Section 106 (Planning) Agreements where finance has been received relating to the West Craven Committee area.
- 13. The Pendle Three-Tier Forum (now disbanded) on 1 April 2014 stressed the need to seek match funding for highway schemes and improvements. It was agreed that the Borough Council via its area committees should approach the County Council for match funding wherever possible.

14. Please refer to the financial implications section of this report. Bids for new funding should be submitted on the usual forms (Form A for internal bids and Form B for external bids) in order that members can evaluate them on a consistent basis.

New/Deferred Bids

- 15. **Premises Improvement Grants:** submitted by Paul Collins on behalf of Housing, Health and Economic Development £13,000; £10,000 for Barnoldswick and £3,000 for Earby (see bid form at Appendix 8).
- 16. **Covered Walkway to Garden Area**: submitted by Friends of Cravenside £2,000 (see bid form at Appendix 9).

Overspend - Additional Funding Required

Possible Future Allocations (no allocation made yet)

20. There were no future allocations at the time of writing the report.

IMPLICATIONS

Policy: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's Corporate Capital Strategy 2015/18.

Financial: Expenditure for capital purposes is primarily expenditure on the acquisition, reclamation or enhancement of assets (eg buildings, land, plant and machinery). "Enhancement" means substantially lengthening the useful life of the asset; substantially increasing its open market value or substantially increasing the use of the asset. Other expenditure for capital purposes can include computer costs (for use over a period exceeding one year) and incidental costs involved in a capital project (eg officers' salaries and professional fees). Anything not covered by "proper practices" must be treated as revenue expenditure.

As in previous years, and in accordance with proper accounting practice, the revenue allocations can be used to fund capital expenditure but under no circumstances can the capital allocation be used to fund revenue expenditure.

A list of good practice in the allocation of funding has been proposed by the Council's Financial Manager in order to assist members when considering the allocation of the capital and revenue budgets. This list is as follows:

- 1. The funding shall assist a scheme which contributes to meeting the Council's corporate priorities.
- 2. Allocate reasonable amounts to projects early to allow for effective planning and implementation.
- 3. Look for opportunities to maximise the effectiveness of the allocation through match funding.
- 4. Consider allowing some contingency for projects that may be presented during the year.
- 5. Try to avoid allocation of funds at the end of the financial year.
- 6. Consider the revenue consequences of capital schemes in terms of ongoing cost.

Legal: There are legal implications for a number of the proposals listed above in terms of necessary permissions, agreements and possible long-term liabilities and responsibilities.

Risk Management: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures. The proper management of the programme is intended to minimise any exposure to unnecessary risk associated with the programme and the individual schemes within it.

Health and Safety: The implementation of the programme has associated risks in terms of health and safety. The Council is required to meet all relevant legal requirements for the effective management of health and safety risk and has policies and procedures in place to ensure health and safety standards are maintained.

Climate Change: Some of the schemes identified will encourage the reduction of carbon emissions such as traffic calming schemes and cycle facility provision.

Community Safety: A number of the schemes listed above have implications in terms of community safety. Wherever possible, the projects are managed in a way that enhances community safety.

Equality and Diversity: the capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures, including those relating to equality and diversity.
