Brief details of Project: This year we updated Pendle's Cycling Legacy Strategy to follow on from the Tour of Britain which came to Pendle last September. The aim of this strategy is to build on the enthusiasm for cycling that was generated by the Tour of Britain to get more people cycling more in particular getting new people on a bike and to highlight the environmental, economic and health benefits. One of the best ways to do this is to show that cycling can be fun.

We would like to hold an event at the Steven Burke Sports Hub to celebrate cycling and to get people thinking about cycling. The event will take place on the 17th September a year after the Tour of Britain came to Pendle. This will include Youth races and there is the possibility of including a sportive that people of all abilities can take part in as well as stalls and cycling activities. What we can put on will depend upon the funding we can achieve. We are asking for £1,000 from each Area Committee.

Main Outcomes to be Achieved: To mark the anniversary of the Tour of Britain in Pendle, to raise awareness of the benefits of cycling, to get more new people interested in cycling, to raise awareness of the easy cycling routes in Pendle, to raise awareness of the Steven Burke Sports Hub

When will Project be implemented? Saturday 17th September with activities leading up to the event such as guided rides, taster sessions and mini challenges

Who will undertake the Project works? Depending on the amount of funding received it will be managed by Pendle Council Officers with support from cycle clubs and organisations such as CDP and CSP. With additional funding we may have assistance from Pennine Events.
