107. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

Mr Anderson of Rothesay Road, Brierfield reported a number of problems in his local area as follows –

- A smell of sewage along Elland Road, Brierfield between numbers 35 and 43. It was agreed that this would be reported to United Utilities.
- Constant littering, particularly on Rothesay Road and Taylor Street. This was an ongoing problem following night time gatherings of people smoking and drinking.
- Broken glass in the Multi Use Games Area following late night anti-social behaviour.
- Overgrown grass verges at Mansfield Grove and Elland Road.
- Broken downstairs windows to Brieffield Town Hall.

• Coping stones missing from the tops of walls outside Brieffield Town Hall.

It was noted that Mr Anderson regularly litter picked the area and it was suggested that other local residents be encouraged to meet on a regular basis to do the same, with the help of ward councillors.

The Environmental Services Manager advised that the Council could support such an initiative by arranging for collected waste to be removed. Support was already provided to other volunteer groups such as 'Pick up for Pendle' who may also be interested in helping.

The Committee agreed that the possibility of creating and delivering a leaflet to local residents be explored. It was noted that the Environmental Crime Team had been involved in a Keep Britain Tidy campaign. This had been a high profile poster campaign to deter littering from parked vehicles. They had also targeted town centres vulnerable to littering. Further advice would be sought from this Team.

It was agreed that all other issues would be reported to the appropriate body/department for action and that Mr Anderson be kept updated on progress with all issues raised.

It was reported that, further to a request at the last meeting, a meeting had been held with members of this Committee and members of St Luke's Parochial Church Council.

RESOLVED

- (i) £1,500 be allocated towards the provision of CCTV cameras around St Luke's Brierfield church buildings.
- (ii) £860 be allocated for strimming, rubbish removal, weedkilling and general clearance of Back Lord Street and Back Every Street, Brierfield.
- (iii) £160 be allocated for the provision of a grit bin, including first fill, on Clements Drive, Reedley.
- (2) That the underspend as detailed in paragraphs 13-17 of the report be de-allocated and returned to the capital programme.

REASON

To ensure the most effective allocation of the Committee's capital budget.
