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CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2016/17

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To update members on the Committee's 2016/17 capital budget.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- (1) That members note that only the schemes listed in Appendix 1 have agreed funding.
- (2) That members consider the new bid in paragraph 9.
- (3) That members consider the underspend in paragraph 12.
- (4) That any late bids be considered by the Committee.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

To enable the capital programme to be allocated efficiently and effectively.

ISSUE

Uncommitted Balance from 2015/16

1. This is £706.

Allocation for 2016/17

2. This is £30,290 capital plus £21,210 revenue contribution to capital – totalling £51,500. However, the £12,120 of the revenue contribution that was held back as cover in the event that savings did not materialise from the transfer of some assets to the town and parish councils from the 2015/16 budget has now been released following the 30 June 2016 Executive meeting. This gives an effective total allocation for 2016/17 of £63,620.

Effective Total Allocation for 2016/17

3. This is £64,326.

Commitments for 2016/17

4. These total £60,051 (see Appendix 1 for a detailed breakdown).

Balance for 2016/17

5. This is £4,275.

Additional Sources of Capital Funding

- 6. Appendix 2 to this report is a list (for information) of current Section 106 (Planning) Agreements where finance has been received provided by Planning and Legal Services relating to the Nelson Committee area.
- 7. The Pendle Three-Tier Forum (now disbanded) stressed at its meeting on 1 April 2014 the need to seek match funding for highway schemes and improvements. It was agreed that the Borough Council via its area committees should approach the County Council for match funding wherever possible.

Late Bids

26. Any late bids will be reported preferably just prior to or at the meeting.

IMPLICATIONS

Policy: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's Corporate Capital Strategy 2015/18.

Financial: Expenditure for capital purposes is primarily expenditure on the acquisition, reclamation or enhancement of assets (eg buildings, land, plant and machinery). "Enhancement" means substantially lengthening the useful life of the asset, substantially increasing its open market value or substantially increasing the use of the asset. Other expenditure for capital purposes can include computer costs (for use over a period exceeding one year) and incidental costs involved in a capital project (eg officers' salaries and professional fees). Anything not covered by "proper practices" must be treated as revenue expenditure.

As in previous years, and in accordance with proper accounting practice, the revenue allocations can be used to fund capital expenditure but under no circumstances can the capital allocation be used to fund revenue expenditure.

A list of good practice in the allocation of funding has been proposed by the Council's Chief Finance Officer in order to assist members when considering the allocation of the capital and revenue budgets. The list is as follows:

- 1. The funding should assist a scheme which contributes to meeting the Council's corporate priorities.
- 2. Allocate reasonable amounts to projects early to allow for effective planning and implementation.
- 3. Look for opportunities to maximise the effectiveness of the allocation through match funding.
- 4. Consider allowing some contingency for projects that may be presented during the year.
- 5. Try to avoid allocation of funds at the end of the financial year.
- 6. Consider the revenue consequences of capital schemes in terms of ongoing cost.

Legal: There are legal implications for a number of the proposals listed above in terms of necessary permissions, agreements and possible long-term liabilities and responsibilities.

Risk Management: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures. The proper management of the programme is intended to minimise any exposure to unnecessary risk associated with the programme and the individual schemes within it.

Health and Safety: The implementation of the programme has associated risks in terms of health and safety. The Council is required to meet all relevant legal requirements for the effective management of health and safety risk and has policies and procedures in place to ensure health and safety standards are maintained.

Climate Change: Some of the schemes identified will encourage the reduction of carbon emissions, such as traffic calming schemes and cycle facility provision.

Community Safety: A number of the schemes listed above have implications in terms of community safety. Wherever possible, the projects are managed in a way that enhances community safety.

Equality and Diversity: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures, including those relating to equality and diversity.

Short Project Title: Walverden Park Drainage Improvement Works

Amount requested: £2,200

Brief details of Project: The park has experienced drainage issues and flooding for a number of years particularly from the top field to the lower level path and beyond. As such, we asked the Council's Drainage Officer to investigate the problem

Fortunately, we seem to have identified the problem. The drainage network that caught water coming off the top field (at the Brunswick Street side of the park), specifically the pipe that runs parallel to the path directly below the top field banking, has been damaged by tree roots

As such, the drainage has not been working properly and a new drain and associated pipework needs to be installed on the top path in addition to a French drain at the edge of the storytelling area on the lowest level of the park (this area gets very boggy and has drainage issues)

The Engineering section has developed the scheme and we have put the works out tender to three local companies. The EAG has already completed a small part of the scheme by digging soil off the top of an existing land drain to improve water flow through existing drainage into Pendle Water at the lower level of the park

The works should improve the flooding issues significantly

Main Outcomes to be Achieved: Improvement of drainage in Walverden Park and alleviation of flooding in certain areas of the site

The works would be in accordance with the Council's Management Plan priority actions as reviewed annually for the Green Flag Award Scheme. This work is also a recognised priority for the Friends Group

When will Project be implemented? Before the end of March 2016

Who will undertake the Project works? Colin Braithwaite (Braithwaite's)

Is the bid for capital or revenue funding? Capital

Is there match funding for the Project from elsewhere? Yes **If so, please give details:** £800 from PBC's Neighbourhood/Environmental Services.

Are there long-term revenue consequences and how will these be funded? No – future maintenance and any cleaning out of gullies/drains will be carried out by the Council's Neighbourhood and Environmental Services
