APPLICATION FOR WORKS TO PROTECTED TREES WAYSIDE COTTAGE, GREENFIELD LANE, COLNE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To grant permission for works to a protected tree.

RECOMMENDATION

Grant permission for works with the condition that the tree is crown lifted to 4 metres, the crown reduced by 1 metre and crown cleaning to British Standard BS 3998:2010.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

To promote good health and management of the tree. Prevent tree from becoming a nuisance in the future.

ISSUE

- 1. A large sycamore tree from an adjacent property dominates one corner of the garden to the rear of Wayside Cottage, Greenfield Lane, Colne.
- 2. The tree is protected by a Tree Preservation Order (TPO/NO2/1990) and is within the Greenfield Conservation Area. A consent must be issued before any works can be carried out on the tree.
- 3. The property belongs to an elected member of the Council and therefore requires the consent of the Area Committee in order to issue a consent notice.
- 4. The tree was inspected by the Principal Environment Officer and was found to be in reasonable health but would benefit from some works to improve its shape and prevent it from becoming a nuisance.
- 5. Work required to the tree would be:

- Crown lift to 4 metres This would allow more light under the tree and prevent lawned areas from dying off and allow these areas to be used by the occupant while retaining the tree. This would also remove a branch/stem union that is mechanically weak and likely to fail in the future.
- Crown reduction by 1 metre This would reduce the height of the tree and the overall spread bringing it back in to a more pleasing shape and make the tree more suited to its surroundings. The benefit of this work is that it relieves biomechanical stresses on the tree without risking damage to the main framework of the tree.
- Crown cleaning This would remove any dead branches from the canopy and those that have weak unions that are likely to fail in the future.
- 6. All works to be carried out British Standard (BS 3998:2010 Tree Work, Recommendations).
