CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2017/18

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To update members on the Committee's 2017/18 capital budget.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- (1) That members note that only the schemes listed in Appendix 1 have agreed funding.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

To enable the capital programme to be allocated efficiently and effectively.

ISSUE

Uncommitted Balance from 2016/17

1. This is £5,749.

New Allocation for 2017/18

2. This is the same as last year, ie £51,500 (comprised of £30,290 capital and £21,210 revenue).

Effective Total Allocation for 2017/18

3. This is £57,249 (made up of £5,749 from 2016/17 - plus £51,500).

Commitments for 2017/18

4. These total £46,118 (see Appendix 1 for a detailed breakdown).

Balance for 2017/18

5. This is £11,131.

IMPLICATIONS

Policy: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's Corporate Capital Strategy 2015/18.

Financial: Expenditure for capital purposes is primarily expenditure on the acquisition, reclamation or enhancement of assets (eg buildings, land, plant and machinery). "Enhancement" means substantially lengthening the useful life of the asset, substantially increasing its open market value or substantially increasing the use of the asset. Other expenditure for capital purposes can include computer costs (for use over a period exceeding one year) and incidental costs involved in a capital project (eg officers' salaries and professional fees). Anything not covered by "proper practices" must be treated as revenue expenditure.

As in previous years, and in accordance with proper accounting practice, the revenue allocations can be used to fund capital expenditure but under no circumstances can the capital allocation be used to fund revenue expenditure.

A list of good practice in the allocation of funding has been proposed by the Council's Chief Finance Officer in order to assist members when considering the allocation of the capital and revenue budgets. The list is as follows:

- 1. The funding should assist a scheme which contributes to meeting the Council's corporate priorities.
- 2. Allocate reasonable amounts to projects early to allow for effective planning and implementation.
- 3. Look for opportunities to maximise the effectiveness of the allocation through match funding.
- 4. Consider allowing some contingency for projects that may be presented during the year.
- 5. Try to avoid allocation of funds at the end of the financial year.
- 6. Consider the revenue consequences of capital schemes in terms of ongoing cost.

Legal: There are legal implications for a number of the proposals listed above in terms of necessary permissions, agreements and possible long-term liabilities and responsibilities.

Risk Management: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures. The proper management of the programme is intended to minimise any exposure to unnecessary risk associated with the programme and the individual schemes within it.

Health and Safety: The implementation of the programme has associated risks in terms of health and safety. The Council is required to meet all relevant legal requirements for the effective management of health and safety risk and has policies and procedures in place to ensure health and safety standards are maintained.

Climate Change: Some of the schemes identified will encourage the reduction of carbon emissions, such as traffic calming schemes and cycle facility provision.

Community Safety: A number of the schemes listed above have implications in terms of community safety. Wherever possible, the projects are managed in a way that enhances community safety.

Equality and Diversity: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures, including those relating to equality and diversity.

Nelson Committee has previously allocated £5,000 and Nelson Town Council has provided the match funding of £5,000. A tendering exercise has been carried out; the lowest tender received is £14,188. A request for the remaining match funding of £2,000 is being sought from Nelson Town Council

Amount requested: £5,000 (50 per cent of the project cost: Nelson Town Council has also allocated £5,000 towards the event)

Brief details of Project: The Nelson Food Festival has been running for the past two years, and has been successfully organised by Scott Dawson Advertising. It is proposed that the 2018 event will again be held in September.

The Food Festival itself was held in September 2017 with around 20 to 30 stalls selling a variety of foods, cooking demonstrations from a celebrity chef and entertainment throughout the day. The event attracted an estimated 9,000 visitors to the town centre. A sample of 40 visitors polled said that 70 per cent of them thought that the event was excellent

Scott Dawson undertook a survey of stall traders and 54 per cent said they had a successful day with 75 per cent interested to book again. It would be useful for the 2018 event and going forward if a general survey of the town's traders were conducted as per the previous event and that any visitor survey asked where people had come from

The total cost to Scott Dawson Advertising to organise and host a Food Festival in 2018 would be £10,000. It is requested that the cost be equally split between Nelson Committee and Nelson Town Council. Nelson Town Council has already agreed to fund the 2018 event with £5,000

It is requested that approval to fund is given as soon as possible so that arrangements can be made for the 2018 event, including confirming sponsorships

Main Outcomes to be Achieved: When will Project be implemented? The exact date is to be confirmed, but the Food Festival is likely to be held in September 2018

Who will undertake the Project works? The Food Festival will be organised and run by Scott Dawson Advertising, working alongside the Chair/Clerk of Nelson Town Council and Pendle's Tourism Officer

Amount requested: £2,000

Brief details of Project: Some of the existing paths are starting to crumble and new tarmac needs laying in certain areas of the park. We also have a number of steep paths within the park that are very slippery and need attention including installation of additional handrails and reconfiguration of existing ones

The state of the paths is causing real concern in terms of the health and safety of users. This issue has also been flagged up in the last two Green Flag Feedback Reports as a major concern and unless we do something proactive about the state of the paths, we may lose our Green Flag Award status in 2018

The application of a Colas bitumen slurry will improve the look and health of the paths whilst making them less slippery

The total cost of the scheme is £4,500

Main Outcomes to be Achieved: Better quality paths, improved health and safety for park users, and to ensure path safety issues highlighted as part of the Green Flag Award Feedback Report are being actioned – unless we do something about the problems we may lose our Green Flag Award status for the park

When will Project be implemented? As soon as funding is secured

Who will undertake the Project works? Landscape Engineering

Is the bid for capital or revenue funding? Capital

Is there match funding for the Project from elsewhere? Yes
If so, please give details: Pendle Council's Neighbourhood Services section has circa £2,500 they can contribute towards the scheme from revenue budgets

Are there long-term revenue consequences and how will these be funded? No – the money will be used for one-off works that will hopefully improve the situation. We do have some revenue budgets for the park that can be used for smaller-scale works and patch-up jobs if necessary
