STREET TRADING CONSENT – DRIVING LICENCE CHECK

(Schedule 4 Local Government [Miscellaneous Provisions] Act 1982)

As part of the Council's Street Trading Policy we are empowered to check applicants' driving licence details, for those who use moving vehicles e.g. ice cream vans. With the abolition of the Driving Licence Counterpart in June 2015 we now do this check online on the GOV.UK website.

There is no charge for this, however to do this, we need the following details from you:

1. Last 8 characters of your DVLA Driving Licence Number:

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2. Your licence 'check code'

To get this code, you will need your Driving Licence Number, National Insurance Number and the postcode which appears on your driving licence.

(The code is case sensitive; please enter carefully or PRINT OFF or email to Licensing)

Introduction

PLEASE NOTE : This course covers aspects of safeguarding which could challenge your emotional wellbeing. If this is the case, please contact your line manager for support before completing this course.

This safeguarding awareness course is for people who might come into contact with or have occasional contact with children or vulnerable adults as part of their work.

The course explains what is meant by the terms used, how to recognise abuse, how to reduce the risk of abuse, and what to do if you suspect abuse or if abuse is disclosed to you.



Audience

Please note that people whose job or study routinely includes direct work with children or vulnerable adults should have in-depth training in safeguarding - this includes nursery workers, students of social work, nursing, medicine, etc.

- What to do if you suspect someone is being abused
- The different types of abuse
- Your role in reporting and preventing adult and child abuse
- How to minimise the risk of abuse
- How to respond to disclosed abuse
