# Welcome to the $32^{nd}$ edition of Frame*work*, the newsletter that keeps you up to date on the Local Plan and emerging planning policy here in Pendle.

On the 19th December 2014, following several rounds of public consultation and refinement of the evidence base, Pendle Council formally submitted its Core Strategy to the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government for independent Examination.

This edition of Framework focuses on the Examination and where you can find out more. Whilst there is some overlap with the content of the previous edition of Framework, we thought it would be useful for you to have everything you needed to help understand and access information on the Examination in a single document.

# **The Examination**

The Examination of the Core Strategy commenced on the date it was submitted to the Secretary of State.

Guidance and information relating to the examination process can be found on the **Planning Inspectorate** website.

#### The Inspector

The Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government has appointed Mr. Mark Dakeyne BA(Hons) MRTPI of the Planning Inspectorate to conduct an Examination to determine whether the Core Strategy is legally compliant and sound.

## The Programme Officer

Pendle Council has appointed Mr. Derek Thomas as the Programme Officer for the Examination.

His role is to deal with all administrative, procedural and programming matters relating to the Examination, and works solely to the direction of the Inspector. All correspondence relating to the Examination should be directed to:

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# **Opportunity to Speak**

The Hearing Sessions provide an opportunity for the Inspector to clarify and / or seek additional information on any issues relating to the 'soundness' of the Core Strategy.

The Inspector has already written to each person who submitted a formal written representation in response to the recent public consultation on the Pre-Submission Draft to:

- ask if they wish to speak at a Hearing Session.
- inform them about the preliminary matters and issues he has identified.

The matters and issues will form the basis of the Hearing Sessions. They can be viewed on the **Examination** webpage (Document I/005), under the heading Key Examination Documents.

Members of the public are not allowed to speak at a Hearing Session, but can attend and observe the proceedings.

# **Document Library**

# **Right to Build**

The Government is committed to increasing housing supply and helping more people to own a home of their own. Custom and self- build housing can play a crucial role in helping to secure greater diversity in the housing market, as well as helping to deliver the homes people want.

The Right to Build seeks to improve the availability of suitable, serviced plots of land for custom build. Local authorities will be required to open, promote and maintain a register for prospective builders so they can assess demand and at the same time look at sites in their ownership to see if they are suitable to be released for custom build housing.

Pendle has been named as one of eleven national vanguards to test how **Right to Build** might work in practice. It will not be a free-for-all. Those looking to build will still need to go through the normal planning application process. But it will open up the opportunity to self-build beyond those with "grand designs" so more people can realise their self-build ambitions.
