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# HACKNEY CARRIAGE DEMAND SURVEY

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

To consider the recommendations of CTS following the publication of the hackney carriage demand survey.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

- (1) That the present limit of 71 hackney carriages be retained.
- (2) That a review of the provision of hackney carriage ranks in Pendle be carried out, in consultation with Lancashire County Council, and a further report be submitted to a future meeting.
- (3) That a further report be submitted once the Secretary of State has made regulations specifying the proportion and type of wheelchair-accessible vehicles that Pendle must licence under the Equalities Act 2010.

### **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS**

- (1) The survey has concluded that there is no significant unmet demand.
- (2) To ensure ranks are in the correct locations for customers and the trade and to look into providing a feeder rank in Colne as identified in the report on page 52.
- (3) To consider future new regulations for wheelchair-accessible vehicles from the Secretary of State.

### BACKGROUND

1. To enable a local authority to take the view that a quantity restriction of hackney carriages can be justified the authority needs to demonstrate that there is no significant unmet demand. This issue is usually addressed by means of a survey sufficiently frequent to be

able to respond to any challenge to the satisfaction of a court. An interval of three years is commonly regarded as the maximum reasonable period between surveys.

- 2. A survey was previously carried out by the Council in 2010 and therefore it was agreed at a meeting of the Executive on 17 October 2013 that a further survey be carried out.
- 3. Following a tender process CTS Consultants were appointed to carry out the survey.

## ISSUES

4. The survey was carried out between December 2013 and March 2014 with the final report being submitted in April 2014. A copy of the report is attached as Appendix 1. It can be also be downloaded at http://www.pendle.gov.uk/downloads/download/2406/hackney\_carriage\_demand\_surveys

### CONCLUSION

- 5. The conclusion in the report is that there is no significant unmet demand and the current level of 71 hackney carriages can be defended in court if challenged.
- 6. The Equality Act is already on the statute books. There is a requirement that any authority with a limit on its number of hackney carriages should ensure no new entrant is refused entry if they are offering a wheelchair-accessible vehicle (WAV) if a given proportion of vehicles had not been achieved. At the present time, the level of WAVs required in a fixed fleet has not been determined, and there is still not a confirmed date.

#### IMPLICATIONS

**Policy:** The current policy is that no more than 71 hackney carriage licences be issued, to include five wheelchair-accessible vehicles.

**Financial:** The cost of the survey has been covered by an increase in the hackney carriage licence fees for a period of three years.

Legal: The Council can defend a court challenge following the completion of the survey.
