Title	Pennine Lancashire Mental Health & Housing Project
Web link	Community Restart - Housing
Text	This is a joint initiative between Pendle, Burnley, Hyndburn, Rossendale and Ribble Valley Borough Councils and Lancashire Care Foundation Trust (LCFT). The project is for people accessing mental health services whose housing situation is seriously affecting their ability to engage with treatment. The scheme brings together mental health services and housing to provide advice and assistance to individuals who are homeless or currently experiencing difficulties in managing their tenancies or whose discharge from psychiatric in-patient units may be delayed by lack of appropriate housing.

Web link	Developing a Dementia-Friendly Community in Pendle
Text	The Council's Executive have agreed in principle of working towards developing a dementia-friendly community in Pendle. A 'Dementia Champion' role has been developed to lead the Council in this work. Awareness raising events and training has been undertaken with staff and Council members with these sessions now being rolled out into the wider community. 38% of all staff within the Council have attended a Dementia Friends session. The session is particularly useful to front line staff who deliver services to the public, as it will help to provide better services to those with dementia. Senior managers are now also better informed of this issue which will help when developing and commissioning services.

Text	<ul> <li>The Council works closely with stakeholders and landowners to develop and adapt access to the Countryside so that it is more accessible for all.</li> <li>Walking Festival – Miles without Stiles walk, 3.5 miles from Wycoller Park. There were 16 walkers this year which included the elderly and two disabled walkers.</li> <li>Adaptation of stiles to gates where appropriate to improve access (and with landowners permission).</li> <li>Spec of 1m wide access on all diversion orders to improve access</li> <li>Removal of steps to a ramp on urban ginnel in Barrowford to assist pram and wheelchair users.</li> <li>Improved access of footpath at Lancaster Gate/Hard Platts – well used by School Children.</li> <li>The Tramper is a specially designed four wheel drive all-terrain electric buggy which can be used off road and even on rough ground, mud and grass. It enables people who have difficulty walking to experience the countryside, woodlands and lakesides; and to accompany their friends and families when out walking. The Trampers are available to hire for free.</li> </ul>
