90. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

Susan Sunderland, from Barrowford, asked on behalf of residents about the future of Barrowford Library, in the light of recent announcements about its potential closure. She thought it was important for the Committee to be aware of the threat to this valuable community resource.

The Chairman said that the Committee shared residents' concerns. County Councillor C. Wakeford said that this was a County Council issue. More would be known after the Council's Budget meeting the following Thursday, and a Cabinet meeting in March. He pointed out that if County Council decided to withdraw funding for the Library, a Friends of Barrowford Library group or another community group or organisation could take on the running of the Library to prevent its closure.
