105. POLICE ISSUES AND COMMUNITY SAFETY ISSUES

Inspector Goodall reported that there had been a large number of Burglaries other than in dwellings throughout February, sixteen of which were within the wards of Bradley and Whitefield. Four shops, which closed on Saturday's, had been broken into. Two individuals had been caught on CCTV footage and identified regarding these incidents.

He informed members that as at 1st April 2016 Neighbourhood Policing was changing and due to this there would be a loss of two Community Beat Managers and two PCSO's within Pendle. Where there was a greater level of crime, specific wards would be assigned Community Beat Manager and where crime levels where low Community Beat Managers would cover several wards.

It was also reported that Inspire Integrated Substance Misuse Service (East Lancashire) was to close its hubs in Clitheroe, Nelson and Rawtenstall from March 2016 as part of a planned phased approach, leaving only hubs in Burnley and Accrington.

Members expressed their concerns regarding the changes to neighbourhood policing and also to the loss of the Inspire hub in Nelson.
