**15. APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE –
COLNE AND NELSON RUGBY CLUB**

The Planning, Building Control and Licensing Services Manager submitted a report regarding an application for a Premises Licence following receipt of representations from local residents and a Responsible Authority.

It was reported that the application had been received from Colne and Nelson Rugby Club Limited of the Clubhouse, Holt house, Harrison Drive, Colne. The applicant already had a Club Premises Certificate in place for the premises, which had been in force since 24th November 2005 albeit with different hours.

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Representation had been received from persons residing in the vicinity of the premises and also from the Council's Environmental Health Department.

The applicant, Christopher Buck, the Steward who would be the Designated Premises Supervisor and objectors to the application Mrs C England, Mrs Riley and Mr Allen attended the hearing and made their representations.

RESOLVED

That having listened to the representations made

- (1) the application for a premises licence be granted subject to all licensable activities being between 08.00 and 23.00 Monday to Sunday and the premises opening hours being from 08.00 to 23.30 Monday to Sunday for both the Clubhouse and the marquee.
- (2) the following conditions be imposed:-
 - a) noise should be monitored at the side and rear of houses at the top of Harrison Drive and at the rear of White Grove.
 - b) noise should be monitored at any other noise sensitive receptors that could be affected during any particular event.
 - c) the sound level meter should be calibrated before and after each set of measurements. In addition, laboratory calibration of the sound level meter and calibrator should be carried out at least once every two years at an appropriately accredited facility. The noise measuring equipment should be operated by a competent person who has received appropriate training.
 - d) all noise measurements taken during events should be logged at the time they are taken and kept for a reasonable time period. Any action taken in relation to noise measurements should be logged and kept for a reasonable time period.
 - e) the licence holder be required to take such measures as the Environmental Health Officer may from time to time require, including, but not limited to, decibel levels

To comply with the following licensing objectives:-

- a) Prevention of Crime and Disorder***
- b) Prevention of Public Nuisance***
- c) The Protection of Children from Harm***
