HIGHWAY MATTERS

8. <u>Street lighting – 164-166 Halifax Road, Brierfield</u>

Further to a decision of this Committee, the Neighbourhood Services Manager reports on the response of Lancashire County Council (LCC) to a request to consider installing a street lighting column outside numbers 164-166 Halifax Road, Brierfield.

LCC advise that they will not consider the request due to the carriageway and footways along this stretch being adequately lit with the columns situated on the opposite side of the road.

They state that the new LED lanterns give greater energy efficiency and require far less maintenance than the sodium lighting they replace, but as the light is more directional, are not to all residents liking.

9. Residents Parking, Hope Street, Brierfield

Further to the Committee's request for information on the possibility of introducing residents only parking on Hope Street, Brierfield, the Neighbourhood Services Manager reports that it is unlikely the street will meet a number of the criteria for resident only parking controls to enable the scheme to be supported by LCC.

Resident only parking controls should only be utilised to deter non-resident parking demand in residential areas close to areas of employment or commercial demand to park on street. They should not be used to penalise one set of residents in an area from parking availability.

In cases of parking for a disabled driver, an application can be made to LCC Highways for a disabled bay.

MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS

10. Environmental Crime

11. Government's Proposed Changes to the Planning System

12. Local Plan Part 2 consultation

At the Executive on 17th November 2016, Members were informed of the progress on the preparation of the Pendle Local Plan Part 2. It was agreed that a cross-party Working Group be established to consider the strategic development of the plan. The first meeting of this group has now been held with the key issues and timetable for the preparation of the plan being discussed.

Also at the Executive, a draft report setting out the scope of the plan (i.e. the issues and policies it will cover – including the amount of housing to be developed in each settlement) and a methodology for the assessment of sites was presented, together with a report on the Green Belt Assessment. It was agreed that these documents would form part of a public consultation. Since the Executive an additional document, the Sustainability Appraisal Scoping Report, has been drafted and will also form part of the consultation.

Members should note that the public consultation on these documents and an additional call for sites will begin in mid-February (dates to be confirmed) and will run for a period of six weeks. This consultation will provide the community and other interested parties with an opportunity to comment on, and shape the direction of, the Local Plan Part 2.

13. Rear of 6-12 Cambridge Street, Brierfield

Enc. The Neighbourhood Services Manager submits the attached report which provides an update on options to improve the condition of the empty terrace at 6-12 Cambridge Street, Brierfield.
