As a local resident and educated High School teacher and someone who has worked with 11- α 21 year olds for over 14 years. I am deeply saddened that yet another local resident is opening Λ alcohol shop in Nelson.

Nelson is one of the most poorest and deprived area in the England. However I believe there are still areas in Nelson that have been looked after by good, strong diverse communities, these people find tranquillity and peace in these streets or areas.

Neighbourhoods where bars, restaurants and liquor and other stores that sell alcohol are close together suffer more frequent incidences of violence and other alcohol-related problems, according to recent research by the Prevention Research Centre and others. The strong connection between alcohol and violence has been clear for a long time – but now we know that this connection also relates to the location of places that sell alcohol.

The First and second objection relates to the prevention of crime and disorder and prevent of public nuisance;

There have been a number of robberies, around the Halifax area where individuals have broken into homes and also made a huge nuisance in the evening. Individuals have gathered at the back of Halifax road (house number 100 to 111) where they have been drinking and swearing and using foul language. By introducing an Alcohol shop opposite this area it will encourage individuals to use this area as a socialising drinking ground. My family have been called racist slurs (Paki, black bastard, terrorist) by individuals who have been to the local shop on place on the hill, where they bought bottles of strong bow, we frighten to inform the police as these individuals know where we live (Receipts of the bottles were found in the litter that was left behind) This is starting to become an on going thing. There are a number of alcohol shops located within the vicinity; we do not need another shop. A lot of elderly people live in the area and are quite vulnerable.

Third and Fourth objection relates to Public Safety and the protection of children from harm;

The shop is based at a very dangerous junction. There is no parking around the shop and public safety is a major concern. As the road is used by hundreds of students that walk to school and home, this includes local primary school and secondary school students. Students cross the road near to the shop to walk through the fields to get the Edge End Avenue, shorter route to school.

The local highway agencies have already objected on the grounds of public safety.

Marsden Heights School is a failing school that is located near by. Ofsted have inspected the school and the outcome has been very poor. Special measures/Inadequate to be precise! We as a community will be failing this school further by giving the shop an alcohol license. With all due respect I am not saying the owner will be selling alcohol to youngsters. However it does occur. As a teacher for the local community I can be confident in saying students will be more tempted to buy alcohol on their way back from school. From my experience students have truanted school and purchased alcohol to drink in the fields opposite the shop.

Also there are concerns that a shop in this vicinity would encourage young people to drink by making alcohol accessible locally and raises the spectre of safeguarding issues, Child sex exploitation etc... children could see "inappropriate behaviour" as a result of adults drinking during school break times and at home times. Myself and my wife will be adopting or fostering young children with mental health problems. These children could be from backgrounds of alcohol abuse and would be very vulnerable. An alcohol shop would not be a good idea to have close by.
