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CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2017/18

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To advise members on the Committee's 2017/18 capital budget.

RECOMMENDATION

- (1) That members note only the schemes listed in Appendix 1 have agreed funding.
- (2) That the new bids at paragraphs 8 and 9 be considered by the Committee.
- (3) That the previous bid at paragraph 10 be reconsidered by the Committee.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

To enable the capital programme funding to be allocated efficiently and effectively.

ISSUE

Uncommitted Balance from 2016/17

1. This is £1,082.

Allocation for 2017/18

2. This is £26,100 capital plus £18,260 revenue contribution to capital – totalling £44,360.

3. This is £45,442.

IMPLICATIONS

Policy: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's Corporate Capital Strategy 2015/18.

Financial: Expenditure for capital purposes is primarily expenditure on the acquisition, reclamation or enhancement of assets (eg buildings, land, plant and machinery). "Enhancement" means substantially lengthening the useful life of the asset, substantially increasing its open market value or substantially increasing the use of the asset. Other expenditure for capital purposes can include computer costs (for use over a period exceeding one year) and incidental costs involved in a capital project (eg officers' salaries and professional fees). Anything not covered by "proper practices" must be treated as revenue expenditure.

As in previous years, and in accordance with proper accounting practice, the revenue allocations can be used to fund capital expenditure but under no circumstances can the capital allocation be used to fund revenue expenditure.

A list of good practice in the allocation of funding has been proposed by the Council's Chief Finance Officer in order to assist members when considering the allocation of the capital and revenue budgets. The list is as follows:

- 1. The funding should assist a scheme which contributes to meeting the Council's corporate priorities.
- 2. Allocate reasonable amounts to projects early to allow for effective planning and implementation.
- 3. Look for opportunities to maximise the effectiveness of the allocation through match funding.
- 4. Consider allowing some contingency for projects that may be presented during the year.
- 5. Try to avoid allocation of funds at the end of the financial year.
- 6. Consider the revenue consequences of capital schemes in terms of ongoing cost.

Legal: There are legal implications for a number of the proposals listed above in terms of necessary permissions, agreements and possible long-term liabilities and responsibilities.

Risk Management: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures. The proper management of the programme is intended to minimise any exposure to unnecessary risk associated with the programme and the individual schemes within it.

Health and Safety: The implementation of the programme has associated risks in terms of health and safety. The Council is required to meet all relevant legal requirements for the effective management of health and safety risk and has policies and procedures in place to ensure health and safety standards are maintained.

Climate Change: Some of the schemes identified will encourage the reduction of carbon emissions, such as traffic calming schemes and cycle facility provision.

Community Safety: A number of the schemes listed above have implications in terms of community safety. Wherever possible, the projects are managed in a way that enhances community safety.

Equality and Diversity: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures, including those relating to equality and diversity.

Brief details of Project: Colne and District Committee approved funding to repair the seven existing road cushions and provide three new "sleeping policeman" style road humps on Greenfield Road to prevent cars using the route as a through road/rat run. During consultations with the residents it was established that the majority thought that a gate, which could be used on a temporary basis as and when needed, would also be a good addition to stop cars using Greenfield Road. Greenfield Road has a "Prohibition of Driving" order on it and so is an access-only road and cars other than residents' cars or visitors to Greenfield Nature Reserve should not be using it. We have a "Public Space Protection" order in place for the gate to be located in its previous position where there is an existing gate post. This would cost in the region of £600 including providing keys to all residents

It is envisaged that the gate would be locked for two weeks to stop cars using the road as a through road after this time the gate could be opened again but may be closed in the future if needed

Brief details of Project: Under the Public Space Protection Order (PSPO), the Neighbourhood Services Manager submitted a report regarding a statutory consultation on proposals to maintain the closure of footways by alleygates scheme. On 12 January 2017, Colne and District Committee resolved that a PSPO for the existing schemes be agreed. There are five alleygate schemes in Colne comprising of eight gates; all the schemes require repair and complete paint work costing £2,095. The schemes are located at:

- Mason Street
- Sutherland Street/Calder Street
- Crabtree Street/Sutherland Street
- Crabtree Street/Smith Street
- Cumberland Street/Cross Skelton Street

Main Outcomes to be achieved: The gates will continue to serve their purpose of reducing crime and antisocial behaviour. The proposed works will prolong the life of the existing gates; repairs and paintwork will improve the appearance of the gates which will add to the uplift of the area
