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## NELSON TOWN CENTRE WALKABOUT

## **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To update Members on progress made on issues identified on the town centre walkabout undertaken on 4<sup>th</sup> September 2017.

## **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS**

To inform Members of the current position and relevant actions/progress following Nelson Town Centre walkabout.

## **ISSUE**

The Nelson Town centre Walkabout was undertaken on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2017 to give Councillors the opportunity to discuss town centre maintenance issues and identify areas that may need some improvement/attention.

On Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2017, Councillors (George Adam, David Whalley and Sheila Wicks) along with relevant officers from Pendle Council (Neighbourhood Services/Economic development) undertook a walkabout through Nelson Town Centre. The aim of the walkabout was to identify any issues which need to be resolved; this included street furniture, buildings, and paving. This was the second annual walkabout held, following the first walkabout held in August 2016.

The walkabouts should take place periodically and aim to maintain a high standard throughout Nelson town centre.

Appendix 1 shows the comprehensive list of identified problem sites within the town, the relevant department which needs to deal with the problem and any actions/work undertaken.

Following the walkabout the action list has been circulated to the relevant department/authority for action/comment. A further update report will be submitted to the Committee in due course.

Further Town Centre walkabouts will be arranged in the early parts of 2018, to identify any further issues and areas for improvement.

**Community Safety:** The actions aim to improve the town centre as a whole to improve the town's image and quality.


**Equality and Diversity:** Undertaking the actions will result in an improved town centre that can be enjoyed by the whole community
