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## **CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2017/18**

### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To advise members on the Committee's 2017/18 capital budget.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

- (1) That members note only the schemes listed in Appendix 1 have agreed funding.
- (2) That the new bid at paragraph 8 be considered by the Committee.
- (3) That the underspend detailed in paragraph 11 be considered by the Committee.

### **REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION**

To enable the capital programme funding to be allocated efficiently and effectively.

### **ISSUE**

#### ***Uncommitted Balance from 2016/17***

1. This is £1,082.

#### ***Allocation for 2017/18***

2. This is £26,100 capital plus £18,260 revenue contribution to capital – totalling £44,360.

#### ***Effective Total Allocation for 2017/18***

3. This is £45,442.

#### ***Commitments for 2017/18***

4. These total **£42,903** (see Appendix 1 for a detailed breakdown).

## **Balance for 2017/18**

5. This is **£2,539**.

## **Additional Sources of Capital Funding**

6. Appendix 2 to this report is a list (for information) of current Section 106 (Planning) Agreements where finance has been received provided by Planning and Legal Services relating to the Colne and District Committee area.

## **New/Deferred Bids**

8. **Replacement of Damaged Street Trees:** submitted by Scott Whalley, Engineering Manager – £388 (see bid at Appendix 3).

## **Existing Bids**

9. **Litter Bins (Appendix 1, item 1).** At the October meeting it was resolved that a report be submitted to the next meeting regarding the cost of providing a dog waste bin on the Rough side of Skipton Old Road, Colne, opposite Bents and replacing the one outside Stanley House Vets, Albert Road, Colne. The Waste Services Manager reports that they erected a bin on Skipton Old Road in early November. With regard to the bin outside the vets, it just needed new handles and the cost of this will be met from existing street cleansing budgets.

## **Overspend – Additional Funding Required**

10. None.

## **Underspend – De-allocate Funding**

11. **New waste bin for Market Street (Appendix 1, item 17).** Neighbourhood Services carried out some town centre improvement works earlier this year and were able to provide a replacement bin using existing funds. Therefore, members are recommended to de-allocate these funds and return the £259 to the capital programme.

#### **IMPLICATIONS**

**Policy:** The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's Corporate Capital Strategy 2015/18.

**Financial:** Expenditure for capital purposes is primarily expenditure on the acquisition, reclamation or enhancement of assets (eg buildings, land, plant and machinery). “Enhancement” means substantially lengthening the useful life of the asset, substantially increasing its open market value or substantially increasing the use of the asset. Other expenditure for capital purposes can include computer costs (for use over a period exceeding one year) and incidental costs involved in a capital project (eg officers’ salaries and professional fees). Anything not covered by “proper practices” must be treated as revenue expenditure.

As in previous years, and in accordance with proper accounting practice, the revenue allocations can be used to fund capital expenditure but under no circumstances can the capital allocation be used to fund revenue expenditure.

A list of good practice in the allocation of funding has been proposed by the Council’s Chief Finance Officer in order to assist members when considering the allocation of the capital and revenue budgets. The list is as follows:

1. The funding should assist a scheme which contributes to meeting the Council’s corporate priorities.
2. Allocate reasonable amounts to projects early to allow for effective planning and implementation.
3. Look for opportunities to maximise the effectiveness of the allocation through match funding.
4. Consider allowing some contingency for projects that may be presented during the year.
5. Try to avoid allocation of funds at the end of the financial year.
6. Consider the revenue consequences of capital schemes in terms of ongoing cost.

**Legal:** There are legal implications for a number of the proposals listed above in terms of necessary permissions, agreements and possible long-term liabilities and responsibilities.

**Risk Management:** The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council’s policies and procedures. The proper management of the programme is intended to minimise any exposure to unnecessary risk associated with the programme and the individual schemes within it.

**Health and Safety:** The implementation of the programme has associated risks in terms of health and safety. The Council is required to meet all relevant legal requirements for the effective management of health and safety risk and has policies and procedures in place to ensure health and safety standards are maintained.

**Climate Change:** Some of the schemes identified will encourage the reduction of carbon emissions, such as traffic calming schemes and cycle facility provision.

**Community Safety:** A number of the schemes listed above have implications in terms of community safety. Wherever possible, the projects are managed in a way that enhances community safety.

**Equality and Diversity:** The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council’s policies and procedures, including those relating to equality and diversity.

**Amount requested:** £388 (£500 required but £112 already allocated so £388 requested this time around)

**Brief details of Project:** Engineers completed schemes in 2014/15 using Cluster Funding for environmental enhancements including street trees in Brierfield, Nelson and Colne. Many of the trees we planted have been vandalised or have not taken and need replacing. The original funding is no longer available and so we are making this request to improve the street scene. The scheme in Colne is as follows:

- Walton Street – 1 tree to be removed and replaced, with fertiliser applied to additional 5 tree pits

**Main Outcomes to be Achieved:** The street will be enhanced and look cared for which should help to deter further vandalism

**When will Project be implemented?** During the planting season, October 2017 to March 2018 should funding be approved

**Who will undertake the Project works?** One of our approved contractors will carry out the works. We have obtained two quotations

**Is the bid for capital or revenue funding?** Capital

**Is there match funding for the Project from elsewhere?** No, the original funding finished

**Are there long-term revenue consequences and how will these be funded?**

No long-term revenue consequence but should the trees be subject to vandalism again in the future we would need to reapply for capital funding to replace them again
