Councillor M. Arshad asked what was happening with the land adjacent to 170 Colne Road, Brierfield (Planning permission had been granted on the site in 2016 (13/15/0549P)).

The original permission dates back to 2003 and has been commenced. A revised application was approved in 2015 from a new owner of the site.

As development has already commenced they have an extant permission which can be implemented.
