LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND HOUSING ACT, 1989 POLITICAL BALANCE RULES

- 1. The political balance rules require the Council to allocate places on relevant committees according to the strengths of the political groups on the Council. The rules apply to the following committees. They do not apply to area committees.
- 2. The political groups and their current strengths are:-

Conservative25Labour15Liberal Democrat9

- 3. As the Conservative Group has a majority on the Council it is entitled under the rules to a majority of the places on each committee. The remaining places are then allocated to the other two groups as far as reasonably practicable to reflect their overall strengths on the Council.
- 4. The overall allocation of seats in committees is as follows:

- 5. This is achieved by multiplying the number of committee places (64) by the number of members in the group and then dividing this by the overall number of Councillors (49).
