4. MATTERS ARISING:

- New padlock on green shed still secure; replacement shed cancelled;
- New Volunteer, Linda Kegg, has helped with Working Parties dealing with tree management and rubbish clearance from Reserve and along river;
- 2 more homeless drug addicts in tents on LNR Environmental Health informed because of residue of needles left scattered around;

6. WORK PROGRAMME:

- Volunteer Manager Report: Paul has assessed work needed doing and has informed Lee Johnson;
- Project using the Tesco Bag Grant: Paul has been in touch with Burnley Community Farm who will provide Volunteers in the New Year to undertake Works Programme under supervision of Paul; Account to be set up with Lanlee for materials;
- Working Parties: As well as 1st Saturdays of month, Paul has also led some on Tuesdays; Quarterly Volunteer Hours to be submitted to Pendle BC to 1st December 2018; Working parties will stop from Dec - Feb and resume on Sat 2nd March 2019 from 10 am;

 as it is deficient in addressing one of its aims: "the decline in species and habitats" and
 how biodiversity can be enhanced; final Strategy will be published for Consultation before
 Local Plan is submitted to Secretary of State;
- RSPB is holding Big Garden Watch over the weekend, 26-28th Jan 2019;
- David recommended that members look at Chris Packham's "People's Manifesto for Wildlife", which has 200 ideas on protecting and improving Biodiversity – a useful checklist.
