1.	<p><u>Planning applications</u></p> <p>18/0898/HHO Full: Erection of two storey side and rear extension at 35 Clegg Street, Brierfield Refused – Referred to Policy and Resources Committee</p>	<p>An element within the planning application was the formation of a driveway. At the meeting, the Policy and Resources Committee was advised that if the road was unclassified then the formation of a driveway would be permitted development. Therefore the Committee granted the Planning, Building Control and Licensing Services Manager delegated authority to approve the application subject to clarification that the provision of car parking and an access would be permitted development.</p>
