SW advised of previous conflicts in<br>the area especially on the bridge where it narrows. JS<br>asked if any traffic management issues had been taken<br>into account with the planning application for the pitch<br>TLM agreed that Pendle would put a speed counter<br>down to check if there were issues and take it forward<br>from there. NH would also refer back to the speed team. |          |
