5. <u>Review topics</u>

To consider any reviews identified by the Pendle Health and Wellbeing Partnership Board (PHWPB) and/or the Council's Policy and Resources Committee. **(Report to follow)**

The reviews carried out by the Panel must be aligned to the Partnership Board's strategic framework and help support the delivery of the PHWPB's work programme. The Partnership Board's priorities are to encourage healthy eating and lifestyles; improve mental health and wellbeing; and improve health outcomes for children and young people.

6. North West Ambulance Service

The Panel members of 2018/19 had been considering whether to lobby the Pennine Lancashire Quality Committee, a body that holds North West Ambulance Service (NWAS) to account, with regard to the monitoring of ambulance response times. By the time of the final meeting, the Panel had still to determine whether it felt the statistics provided gave cause for concern.

Since the last meeting of the Panel, NWAS has been consulting on its draft Quality Account 2018/19, which includes information on ambulance response times. The PHWPB amongst others have been invited to submit any comments on the draft.

The Panel is asked to consider whether it feels that this is sufficient to highlight any areas of concern.

Members are reminded that the monitoring of ambulance response times is a topic that is not compatible with the Partnership Board's work programme and therefore is not a review that can be carried out by this Panel.
