I'm writing to object about the new permanent extended licence for all day entertainment and consumption of alcohol outside from 9.am at Colne Cricket Club,

The forthcoming music festival with live bands all day drinking & dancing in my opinion is not in the correct venue for up to five thousand party-goers, this is a highly populated area which also has two care homes bordering it and these elderly and sick people don't deserve loud music blaring out all day long in the middle of summer at there time of life.

At the moment there permanent licence is for indoor entertainment and that states that they should keep windows & doors closed during an event, but they fail to do that resulting in excessive noise keeping us awake late at night when we need to get up early.

We have never complained in the past as we try to be good neighbours but we are concerned about all day loud music, where five thousand party-goers will park, go to the toilet and who is going to police them during and after the festival.

Recent events resulted in people urinating against the adjoining fence, hedge and trees as there was insufficient toilets (world cup live screening with only three thousand supporters) During the Nov 5th fireworks display our cars, drive, house and gardens where covered with hot spent rockets as the organizers did not take the wind direction into consideration again we did not complain.

I like where I live and I like living next door to the cricket club but with a permanent licence for all day outside drinking & entrainment any time day of the week I fear it will turn into an outdoor events venue which is a long way from a local Cricket Club.

Music festivals should be in a field far away from a residential area.

I look forward to hearing from you in the very near future.
