The contract has been awarded to Blackoak Surfacing Limited and will be funded by Nelson Committee and Nelson Town Council.

(d) Pendle Business Awards 2020

The Policy and Resources Committee on 25th July 2019 agreed that the delivery of the Pendle Business Awards be outsourced to a suitable delivery partner for the 2020 event; that the delivery of the Pendle Business Awards for 2020 be funded to a maximum of £20,000; and the Gearing up for Growth Grants Panel be authorised to agree the allocation of this fund.

Following the funding agreement from the Policy and Resources Committee, a tender brief and timescales were agreed, and proposals were requested for the outsourced delivery of the Awards. Tenders were invited from interested businesses using ProContract (Chest).

In total 8 submissions were received and evaluated on the basis of price and quality.

Pennine Events were the successful tenderer and have been awarded the contract. This was reported to the Gearing up for Growth Panel at its meeting on 24th October, 2019.

The contract will be funded from the Pendle Vision Board budget.

(e) Barnoldswick Business Improvement District (BID)

The Planning, Economic Development and Regulatory Services Team sought to appoint consultants to carry out a two stage BID process including feasibility study, following onto development and implementation, for a Barnoldswick BID. The Business Improvement District

specialist will undertake a feasibility study to establish whether a BID should be pursued in Barnoldswick. If a BID for Barnoldswick is seen to be feasible, it would be required for the appointed specialist to undertake a further development & implementation process to establish and implement a BID for Barnoldswick, Lancashire.

A total of 3 tender submissions were received ranging from £32,960 to £37,500.

In determining the selection, the weightings were applied to a number of criteria in its appraisal of the proposals, outlined in the table below.
