Yes, maintenance of equipment is covered by Parish revenue budget, this includes weekly inspection plus an annual independent inspection. All budgets revised annually at the precept meeting, all Parish spending is published on the council's website.

The village has seen an expansion with the new Seddon Estate, quite a few of the families have children under 4. Currently we have no provision for under fours.

The recreation ground has a small cafe it provides refreshments, drinks, cakes, etc. it's ideal for parents of the toddlers to meet and natter, often young parents in new housed can become isolated and feel alone despite being surrounded by over 100 people.

The new play equipment is intended to be used by toddlers, we see it as a way of parents can develop friendships to help prevent loneliness.

They will also meet other villagers, hopefully this will help to connect the village as a community this is part of the Parish Council's longer term plan to increase activities.
