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CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2019/20 AND 2020/21

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To update members on the Committee's 2019/20 and 2020/21 capital budgets.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

To enable the capital programme to be allocated efficiently and effectively.

ISSUE

Uncommitted Balance from 2019/20

New/Deferred Bids

No late bids or funding allocations are to be made unless, with the consent of the Chairman, the bid is considered to be an urgent item. If a late/urgent bid is approved and is in the opinion of the Chief Finance Officer a revenue item then the decision will be reported to the Policy and Resources Committee for determination. No payment will be made in respect of the bid pending a resolution by the Policy and Resources Committee.

- Highway Improvements (Back 40–70 Lomeshaye Road) submitted by Joanne Laycock on behalf of Cllr Mahmood – £10,000 to provide a highway improvement scheme to Whitefield back street for consideration from 2020/21 budget (see Appendix 3).
- 8. *Highway Improvements (Back 211–259 Manchester Road)* submitted by Joanne Laycock on behalf of Cllr Iqbal £1,500 to provide match contribution towards Nelson Town Council highway improvement scheme to Back Manchester Road (see Appendix 4).
- 9. **Asset Improvement Every Street Gully Pots** submitted by Scott Whalley £500 to enhance the gully pots to improve their life cycle and drainage capacity (see Appendix 5).
- 10. Nelson Cricket Club Re-development of the Former Bowling Green Area submitted by Nick Burton £2,000 to develop the former bowling green area for junior players to play cricket in a safe environment (see Appendix 6).
- 11. Enhancement of Town Centre Canopies submitted by Joanne Laycock £4,000 to enhance the canopies, benches and bins from Leeds Road to Manchester Road to increase the lifespan of these existing assets to a high quality (see Appendix 7).
- 12. Capital Works to Gable and Rear of Crawford Street, Nelson submitted by Joanne Laycock £1,767 (see Appendix 8).

Existing Bids

Overspend – Additional Funding Required

13. Acquisition of Athol Street Triangle (Sch. No. 8): At the June 2019 meeting, £6,291 was de-allocated for Athol Street triangle but only £6,285 remained unspent as a Land Registry

payment was waiting to be processed. A further £40 has been coded to this scheme. Members are therefore requested to re-allocate an additional **£46** to cover the deficit.

14. **Capital Works to Whitefield Ward (Sch. No. 41):** Works have been completed. Total costs are £8,076. £300 has been committed from Cllr Mahmood's Ward Initiative allocation, and therefore there is an outstanding **£499** overspend. Members are requested allocate £499 to cover this overspend.

Underspend – De-allocate Funding

- 15. *Walverden Ward Back Street Upgrade (Sch. No. 38):* Works have been completed at a total cost of £12,293 leaving **£3,207** underspend. Members are therefore requested to deallocate this underspend.
- 16. *Elizabeth Street Contribution (Sch. No. 46):* Works have been completed at a total cost of £13,159 leaving an underspend of **£6,680**. Members are therefore requested to de-allocate this underspend.

18. Back Hereford Street: £300 from Cllr Mahmood towards highway improvements.

January 2020

19. Rock Steady Youth Club: £150 each from Cllrs Ammer, Tennant and Wicks towards a table project.

20. Bradley Boys Cricket Club: £150 from Cllr Aslam towards purchase of cricket equipment.

IMPLICATIONS

Policy: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's Corporate Capital Strategy 2018/21.

Financial: Expenditure for capital purposes is primarily expenditure on the acquisition, reclamation or enhancement of assets (eg buildings, land, plant and machinery). "Enhancement" means substantially lengthening the useful life of the asset, substantially increasing its open market value or substantially increasing the use of the asset. Other expenditure for capital purposes can include computer costs (for use over a period exceeding one year) and incidental costs involved in a capital project (eg officers' salaries and professional fees). Anything not covered by "proper practices" (Section 21(2) of the Local Government Act 2003) must be treated as revenue expenditure. Under no circumstances can the capital allocation be used to fund revenue expenditure.

A list of good practice in the allocation of funding has been proposed by the Council's Chief Finance Officer in order to assist members when considering the allocation of the capital budgets. The list is as follows:

- 1. The funding should assist a scheme which contributes to meeting the Council's corporate priorities.
- 2. Allocate reasonable amounts to projects early to allow for effective planning and implementation.
- 3. Look for opportunities to maximise the effectiveness of the allocation through match funding.
- 4. Consider allowing some contingency for projects that may be presented during the year.
- 5. Try to avoid allocation of funds at the end of the financial year.
- 6. Consider the revenue consequences of capital schemes in terms of ongoing cost.

Legal: There are legal implications for a number of the proposals listed above in terms of necessary permissions, agreements and possible long-term liabilities and responsibilities.

Risk Management: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures. The proper management of the programme is intended to minimise any exposure to unnecessary risk associated with the programme and the individual schemes within it.

Health and Safety: The implementation of the programme has associated risks in terms of health and safety. The Council is required to meet all relevant legal requirements for the effective management of health and safety risk and has policies and procedures in place to ensure health and safety standards are maintained.

Climate Change: Some of the schemes identified will encourage the reduction of carbon emissions, such as traffic calming schemes and cycle facility provision.

Community Safety: A number of the schemes listed above have implications in terms of community safety. Wherever possible, the projects are managed in a way that enhances community safety.

Equality and Diversity: The capital programme is required to be allocated and managed in accordance with the Council's policies and procedures, including those relating to equality and diversity.

6. Amount requested: £2,000

7. Brief details of project: The Club wants to develop the former bowling green area (which has been derelict for five years plus) to provide a safe and self-contained area for our youngest junior players and members. We have groups from five-year-olds upwards and organised sessions on the main cricket field can be difficult to arrange especially if we have other games or senior practice taking place. Our facilities are made available to local schools during the summer holidays and therefore if the area was re-developed it could provide a better quality resource/facility for the wider local community

Currently, the grass is extremely overgrown to a point where we cannot maintain it with our existing equipment/machinery. In addition, a number of leylandii trees that bordered the green have been felled onto the area and need cutting up and removing. There is an old tarmacadam path that runs around the perimeter of the green with a shallow trench between it and the green which is a trip point. See photographs attached of the current state

We would be looking at filling in the trench and seeding it to blend the hard and grass surfaces together making it safer for use by the children. The main area would be cut back and ground improvement works undertaken by a contractor. All overgrown vegetation and weeds would be tackled. See below 1 for photographs of the state of the current site

As you are probably aware, our main source of income is our social club/bar which is currently closed. Consequently, we are struggling to meet our ongoing costs let alone fund developments like the former bowling green project. The funding from the Council would allow us to develop the site to a point where we, as a group of members and volunteers, could then provide the ongoing maintenance of this area

The area would also be used as a family area on match days (for the senior teams) where parents could take their young children to play and relax in a safe attractive environment.

The cost for the ground works is circa £2,000. If it is a little bit more then we will pay the additional costs

8. Main outcomes to be achieved:

- Provide a better quality green space for children/younger members to learn cricket and be active on
- Re-develop an eyesore area within the Cricket Club facility. More aesthetically pleasing
- Ease the pressure on the main first team pitch/field
- Improve health and safety
- Will allow us to maintain a vital sports facility for all age groups that is fit for purpose and serves the local community

9. When will the project be implemented? ASAP – Realistically, this season has more or less been lost due to the coronavirus situation so we aim to do the majority of the work during the summer with a view to getting the new space ready to be used from Spring 2021 (the start of the 2021 Cricket season)

10. Who will undertake the project works? A local contractor – to be decided. We have a couple of contractors who are interested and have provided quotes for us

11. Is there match funding for the project from elsewhere? No although we have an inkind contribution from our volunteers who have stated that they will help the contractors employed to do the clean-up work and once their job is done, we have enough volunteers to maintain and sustain the green space going forward

12. Are there long-term revenue consequences and how will these be funded? No, Nelson Cricket Club members and volunteers will endeavour to maintain the upgraded area once it has been redeveloped.

The section of work identified for Leeds Road area will commence over the summer months. The intention will be to include these works, to Manchester Road town centre area, at the same

F. Main outcomes to be achieved: To enhance and substantially lengthen the useful life of assets within Nelson Town Centre
