FINANCIAL MATTERS

8. <u>Capital Programme 2020/21</u>

The Housing, Health and Engineering Services Manager reports that the unallocated sum of the Committee's 2020/21 Capital Programme is £5,328.

Members are reminded of the £627 remaining in the pot for the provision and maintenance of red grit bins. As previously explained, this is not enough to fill all the bins and, as the maintenance and re-filling of the grit bins is revenue expenditure, no additional funding can be allocated.

Reedley Hallows Parish Council have agreed to maintain the seven red grit bins in their area. This leaves 23 bins in Brierfield which, if not used for their correct purpose will become a hazard on the highway.

A decision on what action to take has been deferred at previous meetings.

Following a recent report of vandalism to one of the bins, Members are asked to reconsider this item. As previously, it is recommended that the remaining funds be used to remove the existing Brierfield bins from site.
