**PROGRESS REPORT ON ACTION ARISING FROM  
BRIERFIELD & REEDLEY COMMITTEE ON 2<sup>ND</sup> DECEMBER, 2020**

<b>1.</b>	<p><b><u>Community Safety Issues and Police Matters</u></b></p> <p>The Chairman expressed concern at the ongoing problem of speeding vehicles on Clitheroe Road, Brierfield and the negative impact this was having on this newly regenerated area. He advised that a number of residents of the new build properties had reported damage to their vehicles as a result.</p> <p>The Committee felt that effective traffic calming measures were required and requested that the Lancashire County Council (LCC) Cabinet Member for Highways and Transport and County Councillor M. Iqbal be invited to meet on site to discuss the issue.</p>	<p><b>Lancashire County Council and the Lancashire Road Safety Partnership are aware of the issue of speeding vehicles on Clitheroe Road, Brierfield.</b></p> <p><b>A request for a site meeting will be made once circumstances allow.</b></p>
