10. Resident's Only Parking Scheme – Holly Street, Nelson

At a meeting of this Committee on 4th January, 2021 it was resolved:

- “(1) That due to the results of the traffic survey providing no evidence to support the introduction of a scheme, a scheme not be introduced on Holly Street, Nelson at this time.
- (2) That resolution (1) above be reviewed once further information regarding the enforcement of the school zigzags has been provided by Lancashire County Council.”

The Housing, Environmental Health and Engineering Services Manager reports that Lancashire County Council's Parking Services department have advised that Walverden School on Holly Street Nelson was visited 3 times in November 2020, when the schools were fully open. No cars were parked on the school zig zags at this time and therefore no Penalty Charge Notices were issued.

Lancashire Parking Services also reported that they have received no complaints about parking on the school zig zags.

Due to the County Council receiving no complaints and the original traffic study not providing evidence of an issue with non-residential parking it is **recommended** that no further action is taken.
