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INVESTMENT IN LEISURE FACILITIES

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. To provide further information to the Committee regarding the proposed strategic review of indoor leisure facilities and investment in the Council's facilities following call in of the decisions made at the Committee's meeting on 16th September.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2. It is recommended that the Committee:
 - a) acknowledges the need for the strategic review to be undertaken in order to be in a position to seek Sport England funding;
 - b) nominates three members to the review Project Group;
 - c) considers the allocation of further funding from the Pendle Leisure Trust reserve for investment in the priority capital repairs set out in the appendix.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

3. To take forward the strategic review to inform future investment in facilities and to carry out urgent repairs

Background

- 4. At the meeting on 16th September the Committee received a report on Investment in Leisure Facilities. This recommended firstly support for a strategic review of indoor leisure provision in the Borough and secondly funding for up to £500,000 for urgent work on various Leisure Trust properties.
- 5. The Committee resolved as follows;
- "(1) That it be noted that Pendle Leisure Trust would be financing the undertaking of a further detailed study on the provision of leisure facilities in Pendle, as set out in the report.

- (2) That the outcome of the study, referred to in (1) above, be reported to a subsequent meeting of this Committee once completed.
- (3) That an allocation of £136k (estimated total works of £121,000 plus fees) be agreed from the Pendle Leisure Trust reserve for investment in priority capital repairs to leisure facilities as follows -

And that consideration be given to the remaining works set out at Appendix A of the report, following further discussions by the Budget Working Group and the outcome of the study by the Leisure Trust."

6. Following the meeting the attached call in notice was a received. In accordance with the procedure a meeting with the callers in was held, a note of which is also on the agenda.

Review of Leisure Provision

- 7. Max Associates who will be conducting the strategic review have now provided a detailed methodology for the review. It will use a Strategic Outcomes Planning Model to develop a clear approach to provide effective and sustainable physical activity and sport opportunities for Pendle. Sport England advises that such an approach is essential for it to make effective investment into provision of both facilities and services.
- 8. The review will be open and wide ranging with no preconceived views as to the outcome.
- 9. It has been agreed with the Leisure Trust that the Project Group for the review will include 3 councillors. This will ensure that the Council is involved in every aspect of the review. The Committee is invited to nominate the councillors. In addition the Chief Executive and another member of Council staff will join the Group.

10. As the Committee has been previously advised the cost of this work is estimated at £40k. Sport England has indicated that it would contribute £10k towards this with the Leisure Trust providing the other £30k.

Priority Capital Repairs

- 11. A list of the proposed repairs which were not approved at the last meeting is submitted as an appendix providing further information on them.
- 12. The Estates and Property Services Manager considers that all are necessary and should be carried out over the next 6 months. Some are the Council's responsibility as the landlord. He also believes the estimates are reasonable but formal tendering will be undertaken.
- 13. As the Committee will recall it was proposed in the previous report that £500k from the Leisure Trust Reserve could be used to fund these repairs. £136k of this was committed at the last meeting.
