West Craven Town Centres Re-opening – WBF Update

PURPOSE OF REPORT

At the time of this report the following progress on these projects is as follows:

- **Earby Planters** George Boococks have now re-painted the planters in Earby. Cost £3,995.
- The town centre website for Barnoldswick is well under way. Businesses have been contacted and the response has been quite good for this type of project. At the time of writing this report we have had the information and pictures back from 24 businesses. Initially all businesses were given a letter on foot by our PBC colleague from the Environmental Health Dept.

This has been followed up by research and follow up calls to 100 businesses. Some receiving several calls. There will be a final follow up to glean their information where we have had no response. Alongside the main business thrust of the site there will be information on community facilities and tourism messages. Although this is a big piece of

work we would hope to be able to have an "in construction" website to show to members before Christmas.

Answers to member's queries from the November meeting:

- Lighting columns No response has been received from LCC asking them to re-paint the base of the lighting columns. Our PBC colleagues in the Engineering section are looking to escalate the request if they receive no further response.
- Earby Public Realm Earby Town Council has been contacted to ask them about the maintenance of street furniture that are their assets. The new town clerk for ETC, Darren Taylor, will be conducting an audit of their assets, which will include an assessment of their condition and need for repairs or maintenance.
- Increase in Barnoldswick Website costs the original ideas for WBF spending included estimates of cost for various items, including the website. The original estimate was for £4k. Once a proper procurement procedure was put in place the actual quotes came back as follows:

What should be noted is:

- a) The cost is for ALL towns including Barnoldswick, Brierfield and Nelson and the cost is split between all
- b) The cheapest quote was chosen
- c) Quality was a consideration. We have dealt with this company before. They are very reliable, highly respected, and extremely professional. The site will also be a Content Managed site which we can manage ourselves
- d) Included in the cost (which is not necessarily true of other companies that quoted) was quite a decent work element of chasing up businesses for the information required for a good site
- e) Although Barnoldswick will get its own website for £5,385 there is a common shared platform which needed to be built for this site which is shared by two other town centre centres so in effect Barnoldswick is only paying 30% of the total cost of £17,940

Non-grant Area Committee funding

After the Committee confirmed that it wished the budget for this be carried over the remaining monies are £3,251. It was agreed that this money would be used for a small stage, to benefit both Barnoldswick and Earby, and indeed events throughout West Craven.

Progress – the stage has now been purchased and it will be reverted to Barnoldswick Town Council to use for events.
