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Pigeons in Colne Town Centre

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To provide information on the location and extent of the pigeons affecting Colne Town Centre and provide recommendations for action.

RECOMMENDATION

That officers engage in initial discussions with the owners of the buildings to see if they will carry out the works required and report back to a future meeting of the Committee.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

To seek to reduce the numbers of pigeons along with the availability of nesting sites in Colne Town Centre.

ISSUE

Pigeons can cause persistent problems at locations where they roost and nest, including bridges, flyovers and other structures.

Whilst it is recognised that pigeons can create a hazard to health, building owners cannot be compelled into protecting their own buildings from providing safe roosting and nesting sites.

Failure to effectively deal with pigeon infestations can result in build-up of guano in public areas. This not only brings about the need for continual monitoring and cleaning but it also has a detrimental impact upon the visual appearance of the Town Centre.

Urban pigeon populations are often sustained, almost exclusively, by deliberate and persistent feeding on the part of a small number of individuals. This single act should be seen as the root cause of most pigeon problems and whilst we can put up signs to try to deter feeding of pigeons in town centre areas, Environmental Health is unable to take enforcement action in order to prevent, cease or deter such behaviour.

Whilst the eradication of pigeons to the Town Centre will never be completely achieved, we would recommend the works set out below for reducing the population and nuisance caused by the pigeons to the Town Centre.
