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PUBLIC SPACE PROTECTION ORDERS/DISTRICT ENFORCEMENT CONTRACT

PURPOSE OF REPORT:

To receive the findings of the reviews requested at Council in February and Policy and Resources Committee in March 2022.

RECOMMENDATION

- (1) That the position on replacement signage be noted.
- (2) That the re-tendering exercise be noted and the outcome be reported to this Committee.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

To address Members' concerns relating to enforcement.

 A report to the Policy and Resources Committee meeting on 17th March advised that a report would be submitted to this meeting on reviews of the Public Space Protection Order signage and of the District Enforcement contract.

Public Space Protection Order Signage

- 2. The Council initially introduced a Public Space Protection Order covering parks and other public spaces on 20th September 2019 following public consultation. It was made in response to growing concerns regarding anti-social behaviour. Amongst its provisions were requirements to keep dogs on leads and exclusion of dogs from certain areas covered by the Orders.
- 3. To inform people of the new provisions and to enable enforcement against offences the Council during 2020 erected 185 signs at all known entrances to parks, cemeteries and sports pitches.

- 4. The Order was renewed following public consultation in January 2022, subject to further discussion with Earby and Barnoldswick Town Councils. We immediately had to replace 7 signs mostly in Victory Park, Barnoldswick due to vandalism or removal. More recently in carrying out this review we have identified a need for a further 30 signs to be erected due to their absence, vandalism or fading.
- 5. Where repeated reports of vandalism have been received we will erect anti vandal casings to protect the signage once displayed. The cost of each casing is £380. To provide 7 casings will cost £2716.
- 6. Arising out of the review we now electronically record the locations of each sign. Records will be updated as additional or replacement signage is erected.

District Enforcement Contract

- 7. As the Committee was advised at the last meeting, due to the disruption to District Enforcement's service caused by the pandemic the contract was extended in July 2021 for a further period of 12 months.
- 8. The following is a breakdown of the fixed penalty fines issued in the last three years:

- 9. With the pending expiry of the current contract we are undertaking a formal re-tendering exercise. Invitations to prospective tenderers have been issued and the exercise is due to be completed by the end of May in time for a new contract to commence at the start of July.
- 10. As with the current contract the Council is seeking to procure a service which has a nil cost to it. The contract will as now cover enforcement of breaches of PSPOs, littering and dog fouling. It will be for three years with a review after 12 months.

11. The main elements will be:

- A managed service with dedicated and regular contact with Council staff
- Provision of suitably trained staff to deliver the roles required
- Management of fixed penalty fines and payments
- Creation of case files for prosecutions
- Educational presentations to schools, neighbourhood groups etc
- Support for volunteer events
- Responsive management of complaints
- 12. The tender evaluation criteria will be split 50% for quality and 50% for price and income.

IMPLICATIONS

Financial: The current contract provides that District Enforcement retain 100% of

the income from FPNs to cover the cost of the service provided and additional income is then shared 50:50 between the Council and District Enforcement. In 2019/20 the Council received £24,910 and in 2020/21

£4760. The figure for 2021/22 is not yet available.

Costs in excess of £3000.00 will be incurred in the replacement and

erection of signage which will be met from existing budgets.
