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# ENVIRONMENTAL BLIGHT

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

To report any new environmental blight sites and provide updates on existing sites.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- (1) That members note the report.
- (2) That members report any new environmental blight sites to the Housing, Health and Engineering Manager for inclusion in future reports including a contact name and contact details with a brief description of the site and problem.

## **REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS**

To deal with environmental blight in the area.

#### ISSUE

- 1. The definition of environmental blight is:
  - Untidy/derelict piece of Council land requiring tidying up.
  - Untidy/derelict piece of unregistered land requiring tidying up.
  - Untidy/derelict piece of Council-owned or unregistered land which needs a scheme to regenerate the site (eg a former garage colony converted to a landscaped parking area).

Private pieces of land requiring tidying are best not dealt with under environmental blight as they may require enforcement. These should be reported to Planning and Building Control to be included on the Problem Buildings list for Section 215 enforcement if the problem is persistent.

The<br>Environmental<br>Services Manager<br>reported that they<br>were working with<br>LCC looking at the<br>possibility of<br>installing cameras as<br>a means of deterring<br>fly-tipping | Environmental Services<br>continues to monitor the site<br>with regular inspections and<br>clearance when necessary<br>In addition, at the November<br>2021 meeting three options for<br>resurfacing the lorry park were<br>considered. Members opted<br>for full resurfacing at a cost of<br>£26,000 but proposed that the<br>cost be shared between<br>Pendle Council and<br>Lancashire County Council<br>with most of Pendle's<br>contribution coming from the<br>central budget and a smaller<br>amount from WCAC Capital<br>Programme. Therefore, the<br>Policy and Resources<br>Committee was recommended<br>to contribute £12,000 towards<br>the scheme from the central<br>pot and LCC be asked to<br>match fund this amount with<br>£2,000 coming from the<br>committee<br>LCC has now agreed to<br>contribute £12,000 and the<br>P&R Committee also resolved<br>on 17.03.22 to provide<br>£12,000 from central funds<br>The scheme is about to go out<br>to tender and the lowest price<br>will be known in a few weeks |
