7. Capital Programme 2022/23

The Housing, Health and Engineering Services Manager reports that the current balance for the Committee's capital programme is £33,340:

- Barnoldswick £22,954
- Earby and Coates £10,386.

HIGHWAYS ISSUES

8. <u>Victoria Road Reflagging Scheme</u>

Policy and Resources Committee meet on 30th June so a verbal update on this Committee's request for funding towards this scheme will be given at the meeting.

Earby Town Council have agreed in principle to contributing to a reflagging scheme. However, they feel strongly that the project should not be extended to include an event space or other enhancements. They consider that repairs should not be delayed by extending the project and subsequent funding required. They are also keen for the funding issue to be pursued with LCC, particularly given the emphasis on its recently published Charter to support Parish & Town Councils and work closer together.

9. Chapman Court Verge

In March the Committee provisionally agreed to allocate £1.5k from the Barnoldswick Councillors' allocation of the Capital Programme towards a £3.5k scheme to surface a strip of grass verge at Chapman Court, an adopted highway, and to ask LCC to contribute the remaining £2k towards the work. LCC indicated that funding for this scheme would not be a priority and so Members went on a site visit to consider whether they should fully fund the scheme. At the last meeting, it was reported that LCC were being asked to reconsider the request. A verbal update will be given at the meeting.

The Housing, Health and Engineering Services Manager reports that confirmed quotes for the works are £3,428.76 and £3,880.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

10. Public Spaces Protection Order – Dog Control

Enc. The Chief Executive submits the attached report which updates the Committee on proposals and options for renewal of the Council's Dog Control Public Spaces Protection Order.

11. Premises Improvement Grant Scheme - Annual Summary

Enc. The Planning, Economic Development and Regulatory Services Manager submits the attached report with a summary on the Premises Improvement Grant scheme in West Craven and asks for representatives to sit on the Premises Improvement Grant Panel.

12. <u>Back Myrtle Grove Car Parking Scheme</u>

13. <u>Items for Discussion</u>

It has been requested that the following items be discussed –

(a) Request for residents only parking on Waterloo Road, Kelbrook

There are problems with non-residents parking on the road. Two residents have mobility issues.

(b) To consider traffic flows and pedestrian areas in Barnoldswick town centre

At a recent site meeting with a representative from LCC to discuss a proposed TRO, it was agreed that there should be an immediate review of driving orders affecting the Albert Road/Frank Street area in order to bring the regulations more in line with actual usage. In addition, it has been suggested that a wider review should be carried out within the town centre area in order to improve accessibility and the overall experience of town centre visitors.

(c) To consider the maintenance of street nameplates

A considerable number of street nameplates, which are maintained by Pendle Council, are in need of attention. The Committee is asked to consider providing additional funding for this service.

(d) To give further consideration to the provision of EV charging points on Wellhouse Road car park

To receive an update following this Committee's resolution on 29th March that agreement in principle be given to the installation of two 120kw chargers on Wellhouse Road car park by Instavolt and, provided that the Property Services Manager was satisfied following the necessary checks on the lease, that this request be dealt with as soon as possible.

- (h) North West Ambulance Service Response Times Quarterly Statistics.
