8. Any Other Business

CSP Main Committee Report 18.07.22 (report from JS)

- Not too much of relevance. We received a presentation from Andrew Wright, formerly of the Road Safety Team, now back in the main constabulary. He explained the long period without reports and expects that from now we should receive regular updates on road accidents. He gave some interesting facts about road safety in Pendle, with no child having been killed on Pendle roads since 2012. There were 3 fatalities in 2021, one pedestrian and two pedal cyclists, in 2020 50% of road fatalities were motor-cyclists.
- Following a sub-committee meeting the priorities for the next Strategic Plan for CSP in Pendle was presented in draft and members asked for comment.
- The Matac Report gave crime data for Pendle April to June. All crime was up 5% with theft up 21% from last year, vehicle offences up 16% and 351 domestic abuse offences which was 18% of all crimes but 10% down on last year; 66% of these were assault with or without injury, harassment or malicious communication. ASB was down 39% on last year and the same as pre-covid figures. Youth- related ASB was 31% of all Pendle ASB, only Burnley with 32% were higher in Pennine Lancs, peak days being Saturday and Sunday and peak hours 1800-2100. Repeat locations were Sainsburys and market St in Colne and Marsden Park Nelson.
- One final point I expressed concern at the poor NPT attendance at our meetings and Sergeant Cooper indicated that now he was in post he would expect this to improve.
