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# COMMUNICATIONS AND ENGAGEMENT UPDATE

## PURPOSE OF REPORT

To update the Board on communication and engagement activities relating to the Town Deal over the last six months and provide information on those planned for the next 3 months. To seek agreement for an updated Communication Strategy Action plan for the next 6 months and review of the Town deal website.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Board:

- (1) Note the communication and engagement activities relating to the Town Deal and it's projects that have been carried out over the last six months.
- (2) Review the planned activities for the next 3 months and agree to the proposal to create a new action plan for the following 6 months, and review of the Town Deal website.

## **REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS**

To agree a planned approach for regular and consistent communications regarding the Town Deal and its projects.

### ISSUE

### Background

- 1. The Communications Strategy for Nelson Town Deal was approved in February 2022 and aimed to:
  - Raise the profile of Nelson as a place with a brighter future including the Nelson Town Deal board's vision for Nelson

- Demonstrate the efforts partners in the Nelson Town Deal board are making to tackle the challenges faced by our town through the Town Investment Plan including realising our vision for Nelson.
- Encourage more positive perceptions about Nelson, including pride in our town and encourage participation in sharing views and in getting involved in projects
- Take the community with us on the journey to a future with brighter prospects and a better quality of life for Nelson people of all ages.
- 2. At that time a six month action plan was agreed from January to June 2022. This was not updated due to dealing with other work priorities but communication and engagement continued in the second half of the year.
- 3. From June 2022 to December 2022 the following news stories have been reported:
