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COUNCIL TAX RESOLUTION 2023/24

PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is present the Council Tax Resolutions to be agreed by Council. This is a technical requirement predicated on the Council's approval of the General Fund Revenue Budget for 2023/24 which is elsewhere on the Agenda for this meeting.

RECOMMENDATIONS

To agree the Council Tax Resolutions provided at Appendix A.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

To comply with regulations for the setting of the Council Tax

ISSUE

1. Elsewhere on the Agenda for this meeting, the Council will consider the General Fund Revenue Budget for 2023/24. As part of this, the Council will agree the amount of Council Tax that will be charged for the services provided by Pendle Borough Council.
2. The total amount charge is based on the Council tax base which takes account of the number of properties across the Borough, the level of Council Tax Support residents receive and the assumed rate of collection. Combining these factors, gives a tax base for the year 2023/24 of 24,776.4, an overall increase of 3.5%.
3. Following agreement of the budget and Council Tax for 2023/24, the Council is required to make various resolutions relating to the overall Council Tax charges for 2023/24 (which incorporate the agreed Council Tax charges for the Major Preceptors (Lancashire County Council, Police and Crime Commissioner and Lancashire Combined Fire Authority) and Local Precepts from Town and Parish Councils). These resolutions are set out in **Appendix A**.

Referendum Limits and Other Precetors

4. Government sets referendum limits each year. For 2023/24 these are out in The Referendums Relating to Council Tax Increases (Principles) (England) Report 2023/24 and outlined in the table below.

5. For Pendle Council, the resolutions provided at Appendix A are based on a Band D Council Tax figure of £289.92 for 2023/24, an increase of 2.99%.
6. Members should note that if the agreed Council Tax differs from that recommended (2.99% increase), the resolutions provided at Appendix A will have to be revised accordingly.
7. For the other bodies, the resolution reflects the decisions they have taken or are expected to take in relation to their own budgets (which are not a matter for Pendle Council). At the time of writing this report, Lancashire County Council, the Police and Crime Commissioner and the Combined Fire Authority had not formally agreed their Council Tax so these may also be subject to change.
