				'I met top infants, their class teacher and Headmistress, Sharon Taylor. The two pupils were members of the Eco Council (the rest were off for Eid).
				Do I think our grant had been well spent? Not really - note the bug hotel could have been done for free. However, I do not doubt the commitment of Mrs Bowie or her charges. They have been busy tackling the mountains of litter that surround the school. I have undertaken to deal with the obvious fly tipping and they were delighted.
				The school itself declared a climate emergency last year. It has two water butts and has consultants coming in to advise on how they could lower their water use further. Mrs Bowie has recruited the Eco Council to sneak on teachers who leave lights on or computer screens on when not in use, so there can be demonstrable behaviour change. The pupils love this and their eyes shone telling me about it.
				Their foray into composting has been beset by disaster, as the mounds of fruit from the kitchens caused a plague of fruit flies and these invaded Year 4 As a result, they are now only doing winter composting. It was disappointing that the children themselves don't do any gardening - the school employs a gardener.'

Crops they are growing include peas, beans, potatoes, strawberries, onions, leeks, herbs, rhubarb, broccoli, cauliflower, cabbages gooseberries and pumpkins!'
