Purpose

To build safer communities by working together to seek to enhance the quality of life for the communities of Pendle.

- Reducing people's fears about crime
- Reducing opportunities for crime
- Tackling the causes of crime

To gain a commitment to a partnership approach which adds value through a multi-agency approach to creating safer communities in Pendle.

To receive updates on developments and intelligence and pro-actively respond to existing and emerging community safety issues.

To develop a three-yearly Community Safety Partnership Plan, using the Strategic Assessment and local data, to help identify changing priorities. This will be monitored at Pendle Community Safety Partnership meetings.

To work strategically with Pennine Community Safety Partnership and Lancashire Community Safety Board.
