#### 15. NOTICES OF MOTION

# (a) Electoral Abuse

To be moved by Councillor M. Iqbal and seconded by Councillor D. Whipp –

Council congratulates all those dedicated members of staff who ensured a smooth election process.

Council notes that Section 4 Elections Act 2022 makes it an offence for candidates or campaigners to handle postal ballot papers.

Council notes with concern the unusual high number of postal vote returns in Bradley ward 48 hours before polling day.

Council notes this is the second year running where over 1000 postal votes are returned 2-3 days before polling day in Bardley ward.

Council resolves to:

- (1) Ask the Returning Officer to write to the Electoral Commission asking for an independent investigation by all authorities concerned to ensure no irregularities have occurred.
- (2) Write to HM Government to introduce legislation giving Returning Officers the power to reject postal votes where suspicious harvesting/storage of postal votes is taking place in a particular area.

#### (b) Highway Maintenance

To be moved by Councillor D. Lord and seconded by Councillor D. Hartley –

Council notes the refusal of Lancashire County Council's Cabinet Member for Highways to our recent request for him to visit Pendle and meet with councillors to discuss the appalling condition of roads and pavements in Pendle, where he says, "a meeting would not add a further understanding or value to the current situation."

Council therefore reaffirms its previous resolution and repeats the request for the Cabinet Member to visit Pendle and see for himself the delipidated surfaces and inadequate repairs being carried out.

# (c) Taxi Licensing

Council notes the current taxi licensing policy (section 5.4) which prevents a licence application being submitted within 12 months of a refusal.

Council resolves to remove section 4.5 from the taxi licensing policy.
