

A detailed analysis of the second YouTube video has been prepared by the Investigating Officer and this provides evidence to cover all the complaints that occurred in the council chamber. The video recording is 6 minutes and 11 seconds.

Time period in minutes and seconds on video recording	Observations
0.00 – 0.08	The Council Leader, Councillor Nadeem Ahmed is standing and talking about standing orders
0.08 – 0.56	Councillor Faraz Ahmad stands up and addresses the mayor regarding suspension of standing orders
0.56 – 1.14	The mayor, Councillor Yasser Iqbal, addresses the meeting and he refers to Councillor Nadeem Ahmed
1.14 – 1.19	Councillor Zafar Ali stands and addresses the mayor and then sits down
1.19	Council Leader, Councillor Nadeem Ahmed starts to address the meeting
1.25	Most of the Labour, Liberal Democrat and one Independent Councillor rise from their seats and start to leave the council chamber
1.54	The Labour, Liberal Democrat and one Independent Councillors, who chose to do so, have left the room except for Councillor Faraz Ahmad, who is collecting paperwork and empty cardboard drinks cups from the desks. The Mayor, Councillor Yasser Iqbal, who is a Labour Councillor and the Deputy Mayor, Brian Newman, who is a Liberal Democrat Councillor remain in the council chamber. Council Leader, Councillor Nadeem Ahmed has sat down, and the mayor is addressing the meeting.
2.05	Councillor Neil Butterworth puts up his hand, stands up and addresses the mayor.
2.11 – 2.22	Councillor David Albin stands up and walks across to the open chamber doorway. Councillor Albin pulls the chamber door towards him with his right hand, he then closes the door with his left hand on the door handle at 2.22. Councillor Faraz

	<p>Ahmad is still in the council chamber having dropped an empty cardboard drinks cup off the back of the desks where some of the Labour and Independent councillors were sitting before they left the chamber. Councillor Faraz Ahmad had walked around the desks to retrieve the cup.</p>
2.23 – 2.24	<p>The rear council chamber door opened from the corridor outside the council chamber. The door opens inwardly into the chamber. The door is opened with considerable force and the door handle is wrenched from Councillor David Albin's left hand and bounces back towards him. The door can be seen to bang against either the extent of its own hinges or possibly some sort of doorstop that is fitted on the floor of the chamber. On the video, several Conservative Councillors can be seen looking towards the open door. Those are Councillors Mike Goulthorp, Kieran McGladdery, Ash Sutcliffe, Mohammad Aslam, and Kevin Salter. Councillor Faraz Ahmad is walking towards the chamber door as this happens.</p>
2.28	<p>Councillor David Albin can be seen holding his left hand as he turns, looking towards the mayor. Someone shouts, 'What's happening?' That would appear and sound to be Councillor David Albin. The Conservative Councillors are then all looking towards Councillor David Albin and the chamber door.</p>
2.37	<p>Councillor Neil Butterworth stands up and points towards the chamber door. Councillor Faraz Ahmad is still collecting the cardboard drinks cups. Councillor David Albin looks out of the open door and speaks to someone in the corridor. The conversation cannot be heard on the video.</p>
2.46	<p>Councillor Faraz Ahmad walks towards the chamber door and places his right hand on Councillor David Albin's back.</p>
2.49	<p>Councillor David Albin recloses the door. The door is opened, without any force being applied and Councillor</p>

	Faraz Ahmad leaves the council chamber.
3.02 – 3.17	<p>Councillor David Albin returns to his seat. Discussions are still ongoing between the Conservatives councillors and the persons seated on the higher tier of seating, i.e. the mayor, the council leader and council officers. Councillor Jenny Purcell gets up from her seat and walks towards the council chamber door. Councillor Purcell walks across the open doorway and closes the chamber door using her left hand at 3.14.</p> <p>Prior to Councillor Jenny Purcell closing the door, Councillor David Whipp can be seen in the doorway, standing at right angles to the door and facing towards it.</p> <p>At 3.17, Councillor Purcell stands with her back towards the door with her arms folded in front of her.</p>
3.18	The council chamber door is opened with force. The first push on the door from outside in the corridor moves Councillor Purcell's body away from the door. A second, harder push, moves Councillor Purcell again and she has to grasp the desk in front of her with her right hand to steady herself and to prevent herself falling over.
3.25	Councillor Jenny Purcell takes hold of the door handle and partially closes the door. Councillor Purcell speaks to the people on the higher tier of seating, including the mayor. Councillor Purcell then closes the door and returns to her seat.
3.45	The chamber door is opened again from the corridor. During the time period 2.23 to 3.46 of the video, discussions have ongoing between the Conservatives councillors and the persons seated on the higher tier of seating. These discussions were interspersed with comments regarding the incidents taking place with the chamber door.
4.03	The meeting is ended and the Mayor's Attendant, Trish Judson stands up out of her seat.

4.14	Discussions in the council chamber have become quite chaotic and it is not possible to hear everything that is being said. A councillor can be heard saying that 'I have never seen such a shambles in my life'.
4.45	The mayor stands to leave the council chamber and his attendant, Trish Judson, carries the Civic Mace out of the council chamber. Several Liberal Democrat councillors can be seen in the corridor, Chris Church, Dorothy Lord, and David Whipp. The councillors in the chamber begin preparing to leave after the mayor had left the chamber.
5.11	Councillor Mike Goulthorp gets up from his seat and closes the chamber door.
5.17	The door is re-opened from the corridor side.
5.33 – 5.49	5.33 Liberal Democrat Councillors are seen stood in the corridor. 5.34 Councillor Dorothy Lord is stood in the doorway with the other Liberal Democrat councillors behind her. The atmosphere is charged with animosity from many of the councillors in the chamber and it is very noisy, there are a lot of people talking at the same time. Councillor David Cockburn-Price is gathering his belongings, he looks over to the doorway, he raises his right arm above his head and waves his hand in the direction of the council chamber door, whilst saying, 'Go away, go away'. 5.38 - Councillor David Cockburn-Price has lowered his arm and is gathering his belongings. 5.40 - Councillor Dorothy Lord has remained stood in the doorway with the other Liberal Democrat councillors behind her. Councillor David Cockburn-Price says, 'Waste of time'. This does not appear to be directed at any particular person or persons. 5.44 Councillor Dorothy Lord has entered the council chamber.

	<p>5.48 Councillor Dorothy Lord has entered further into the chamber and Councillor David Whipp comes through the doorway, approximately 12 seconds after Councillor Dorothy Lord entered, followed by Councillor Tom Whipp. Councillor David Cockburn-Price then says, 'You have no idea what you are doing'. Councillor David Cockburn-Price appears to raise his right arm to waist height, but it is obscured by other people stood in front of him.</p>
5.49 – 6.11	<p>The Liberal Democrat Councillors collect their paperwork and Councillor Tom Whipp walks towards the direction of the camera and it is then switched off.</p>
