This Order may be cited as the Borough Council of Pendle (Sports Grounds) Public Spaces Protection Order 2025 Extension (Under Section 60) of Public Spaces Protection Order 2019

Whereas on 29th January 2019 the Borough Council of Pendle (“the Council”) made the Public Spaces Protection Order 2019 (“2019 Order”) which was extended and varied on 28th January 2022 because the Council was satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 59 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 (“the Act”) have been met in relation to the areas included in the Schedule to the 2019 Order (“the area”)

This Order, made under Section 60(2) of the Act, is an extension of the 2019 Order because the Council is satisfied on reasonable grounds that extending the 2019 Order is necessary to impose the prohibitions and restrictions detailed in the 2019 Order.

The effect of this 2025 Order is to extend the period for which the 2019 Order has effect and unless otherwise stated, the effect of this Order is to continue to impose the prohibitions and restrictions detailed in the 2019 Order and which prohibitions and restrictions shall apply to all persons at all times of the day and night throughout the entirety of the land to which this Order applies

This Order:

1. This Order shall come into force on 28th January 2025 for a period of three years and may be extended subject to further consultation with the public and whether it is reasonable to do so within the council’s statutory powers
2. If any interested person desires to question the validity of this Order on the grounds that the Council had no power to make it or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with in relation to this Order, he or she may apply to the High Court within 6 weeks from the date on which this Order is made.
