Pendle's recycling performance is quite strong when compared to nearest neighbours. Dry Mixed Recycling 2nd highest tonnage, paper and card 3rd highest, organics highest.

Most damaging factor is our residual waste tonnages. The table above shows our none recycling stream (grey bin and bulky stream) impacts greatly on our recycling rate.

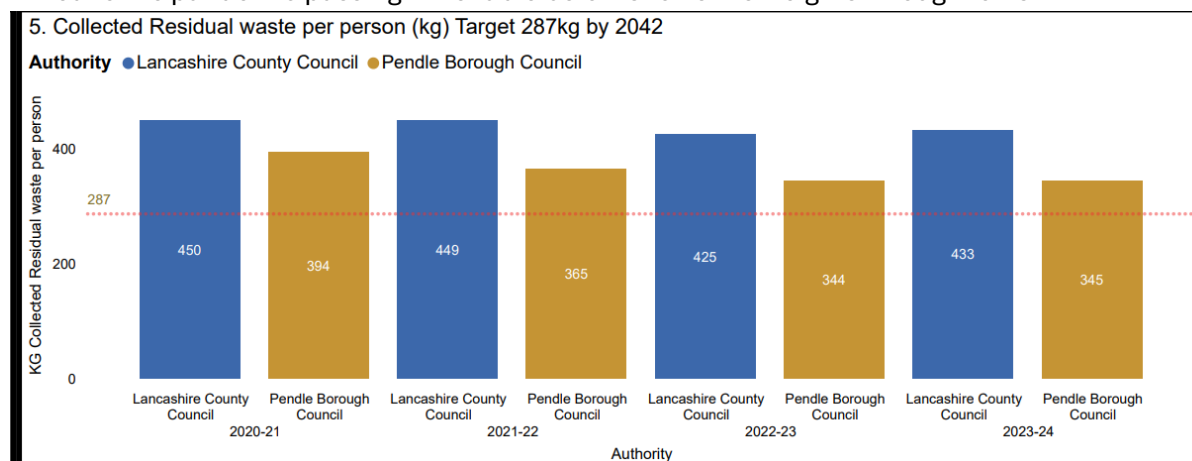

Pendle's collected household waste per person has dropped from 2020/21 which is probably linked to the pandemic passing. The table below shows the weights through to 23/24.



Pendle's total collected has dropped from 394kg to 345kg per person. Again, this can be linked to residents returning to work rather than working from home. There could be also a link to garden waste, we saw increases in 2020/2021 when residents tended to their gardens more as activities were locked down.

Looking at the top rated Council, St Albans City and District from their website they do offer more services than Pendle does and they restrict the amount of none recycling waste they will collect. The website states 3 sacks per fortnight.

Dry Mixed Recycling looks the same
Paper and card looks the same
They have subscribed gardens scheme
They will accept small electrical appliances and textiles
They provide weekly food waste collections
They charge for bulky household collections.
