Consultation has occurred with various agencies concerned with homelessness across Burnley, Pendle and Rossendale. These agencies included registered providers, supported housing providers, local advice & support agencies, Probation / Community Rehabilitation Company (CRC), Job Centre+, health workers, drugs & alcohol mis-use services, Children's Social Care, Councillors and Pendle Borough Council departments.

All members of the Burnley, Pendle and Rossendale Homelessness Forum and service users of Safespace supported housing scheme were invited to provide comment/ feedback on the following three questions:

- What do you think are likely to be the biggest challenges over the next 5 years for homelessness services?
- What improvements / changes would agencies like to see in homelessness service provision?
- Any further ideas which you would like to put forward
