## 4. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

The Assistant Director Planning, Building Control and Regulatory Services submitted a report on the following planning application for determination -

25/0136/FUL Full: Change of use from a dwelling (Use Class C3) to a children's care home (Use Class C2) for 1 no. child at 28 Avon Drive, Barnoldswick for Murtaza Ahmed Hussain

(A site visit was carried out prior to the meeting.)

At a meeting of West Craven Committee on 6<sup>th</sup> May 2025 the decision to refuse this application was referred as a recommendation to this Committee as there was a significant risk of costs being awarded against the Council in the event of an appeal.

#### **RESOLVED**

That planning permission be **refused** for the following reasons –

- The development would lead to an increase in vehicular movement and parking on the highway in an area that has a narrow highway and which has inadequate off-street parking. The increase in use of the building would lead to on-street parking which would be inimical to highways safety contrary to paragraphs 116 and 117 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
- 2. The proposed use as a facility for people suffering from mental health issues would create a safety issue in the local community resulting in a perception of harm to members of the public contrary to paragraph 96 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
